The Champlain Canal is a 60-mile connection of the Hudson River to Lake Champlain. It was simultaneously constructed with the Erie Canal for use by commercial vessels, fully opening in 1823.

Lock C4 is a component of the nationally significant NYS Barge Cana which opened in 1918. The lock still has the original DC electro-mechanical gate and valve operating machinery.
