In appreciation of this and many other outstanding services that they have performed on our behalf we thank and salute them.

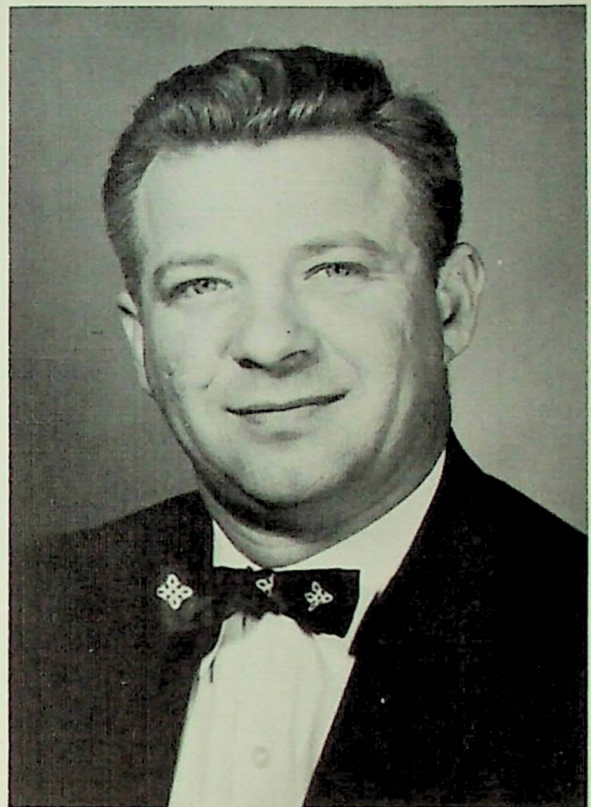
