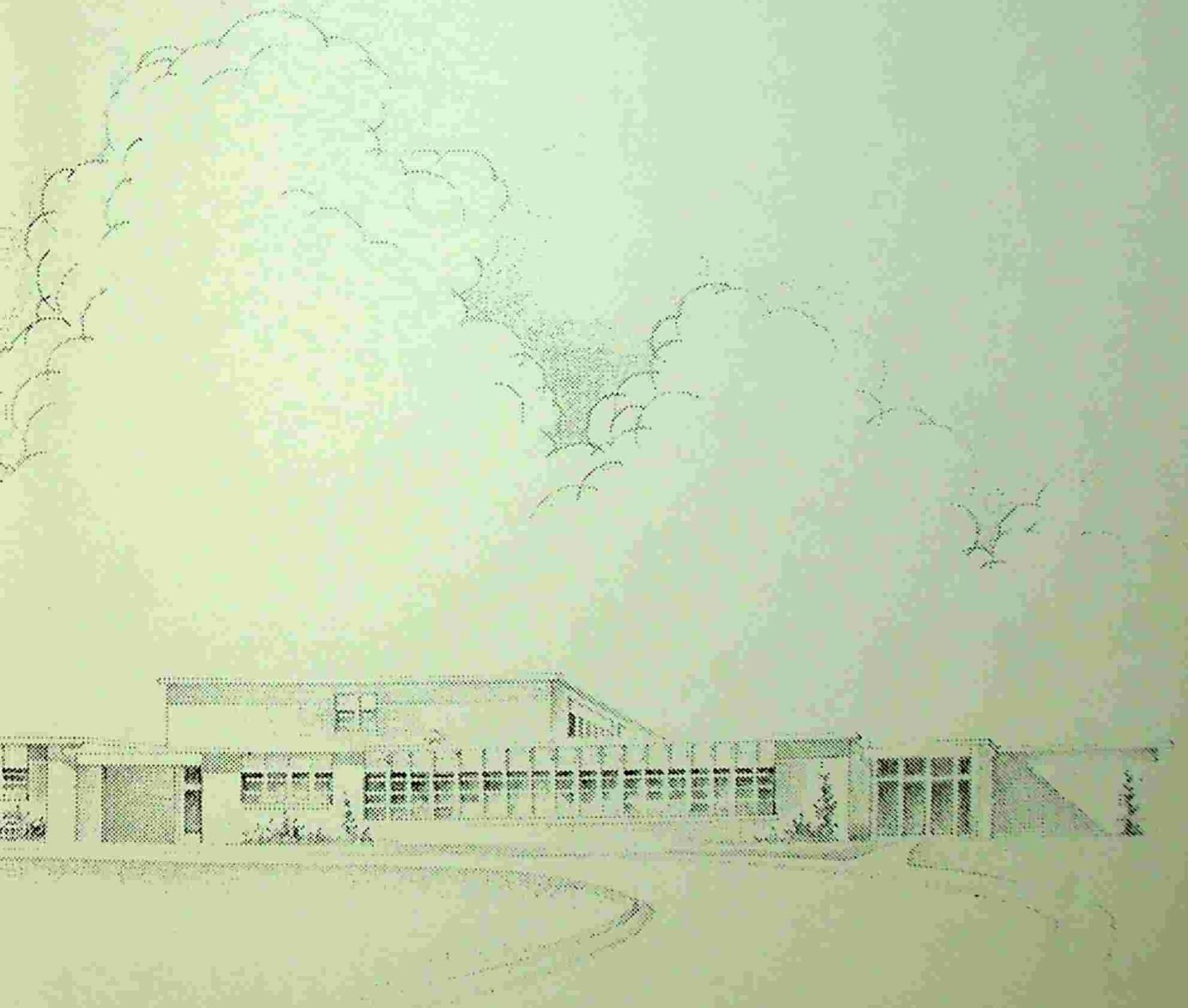

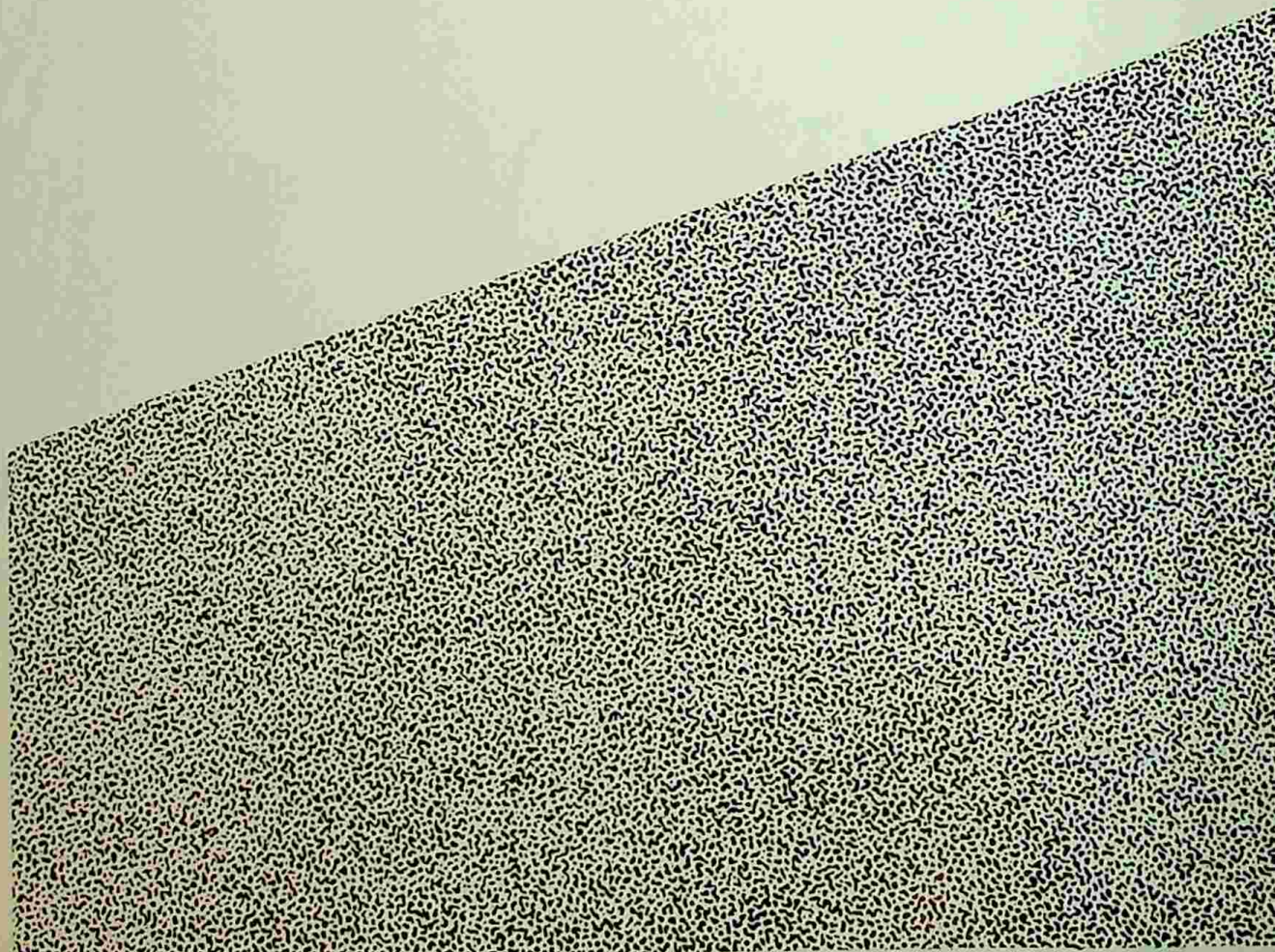
Dedication

The yearbook; magazine and candy sales; dances; and the senior play, "The Man Who Came To Dinner," took up much of our time.

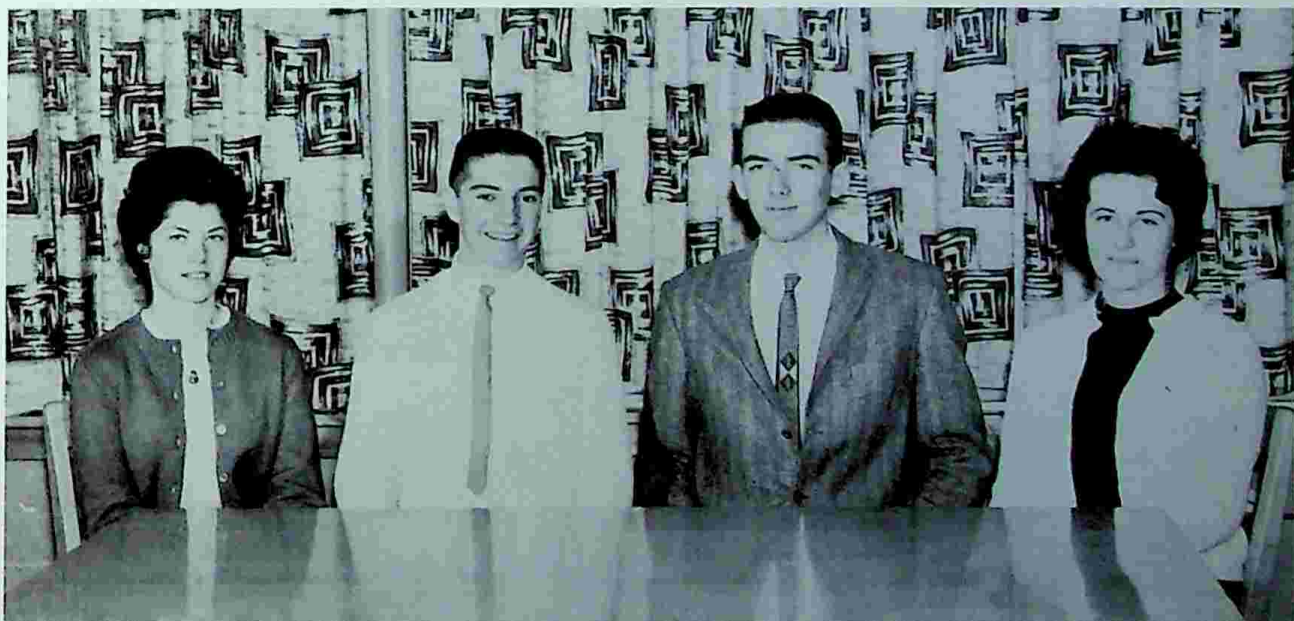
Although our senior year was the most hectic of our four years, we have had many memorable experiences as a class. It was loads of fun and I am sure we will never forget it.
