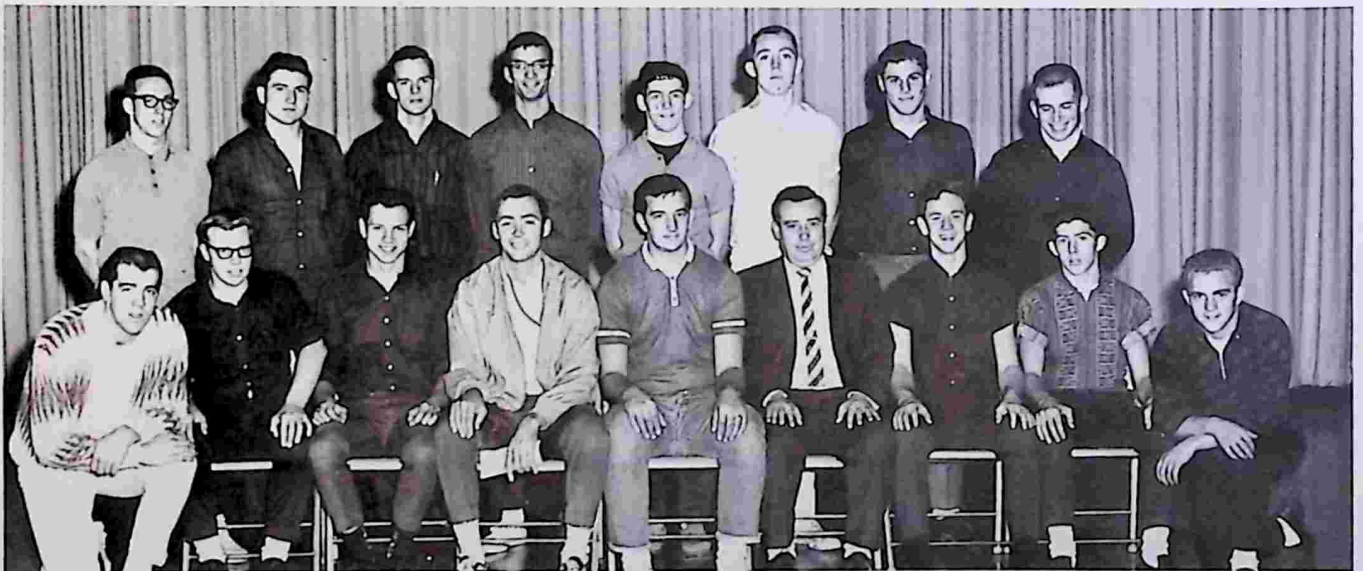

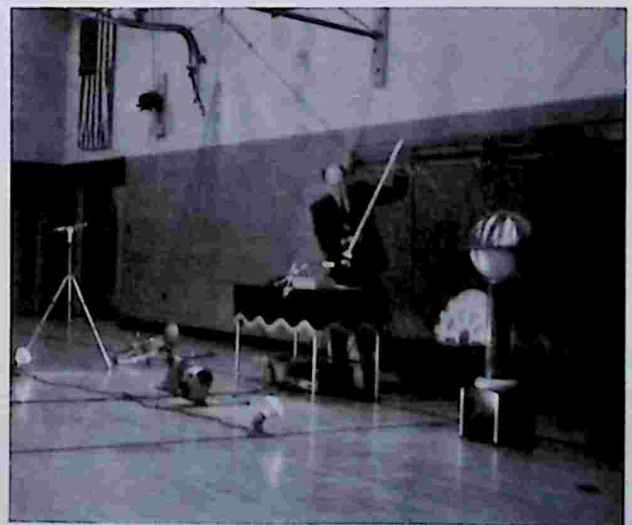

## THE 1963-64 SEASON

The Varsity Football Team had high hopes for the 1963-64 season, but, hampered by injuries and penalties, they finished with a disappointing record of three wins and four losses. The first game proved to be a stereo-type for the year as the Warriors were beaten 7-0 on a 4th quarter pass play.

However, the next Saturday the Warriors were back on their winning ways as they turned back Salem on two first-half touchdowns. On the following Saturday, the Warriors again saw the scoreboard read 7-0, this time in favor of a hard tackling Fort Edward team. A week later, at Hoosick Falls, the team lost another heartbreaker as the home team scored in the first quarter and used a tough defense to contain Stillwater's T-offense. This game was noted as one of the areas best defensive struggles of the year.

Against the Indians of Cambridge, the Warriors came from behind to score an upset victory over a team in contention for the league lead. Their 26 point output was the best offensive performance of the year for the Warriors. Leading the way was the pass catching of end Paul DeCota and outstanding blocking by the entire front line.

In the only night game of theyear, played under the lights at St. Peter's, only one touchdown was scored, a pass play by the Saints. This was the third 7-0 loss for the season and was again the result of penalties and fumbles.

The Stillwater team saved their finest game for the league's previously unbeaten champions, Greenwich. The entire forward wall of DeCota, Charbonneau, Boucher, Talmadge, Faman, Co-Captain Walbroehl, and Spickler turned in their best blocking performance while backs Bryan, Marshall, Phelps, and Co-Captain Palmieri did the running and passing which resulted in a 13-7 upset. The aggressive defensive team did an excellent job in containing the Witches' offensive, intercepting passes and stopping their ground game whenever the Witches threatened.

All in all, the season was not as rich in victory as was hoped, but the exciting moments of it will not be forgotten by anyone.

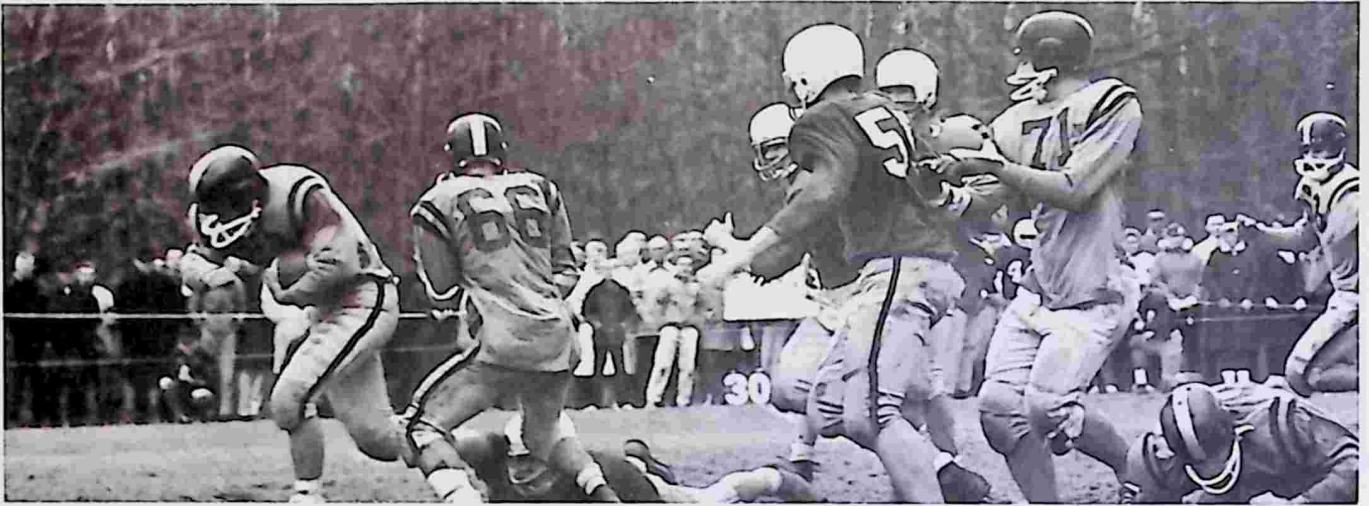

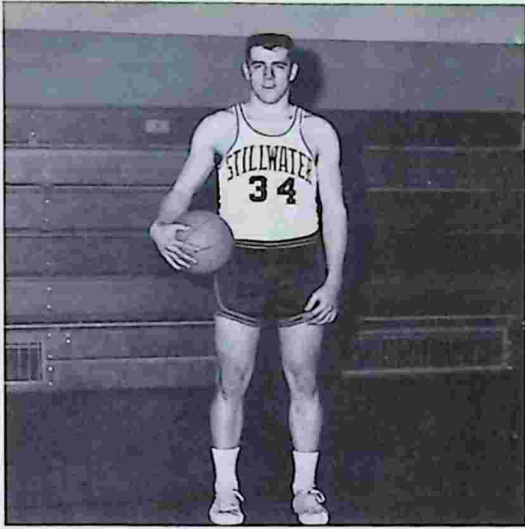
## The 1963-64 Season

After a slow start in which they lost their first four games, the Varsity team came back to defeat Tamarac and then continued at a .500 win -- loss percentage for the remainder of the season.

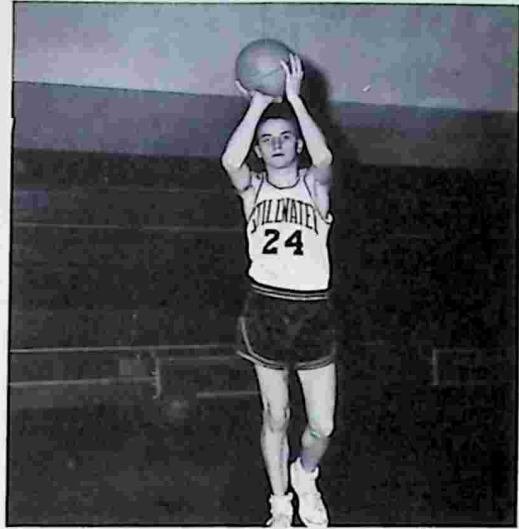
