The Battle of Saratoga is considered by most historians to be the turning point of the war of independence for the American Colonies--a battle in which a supposedly ill-equipped, poorly trained group of militiamen defeated what was probably one of the best armies in the world. It was there, in a fortress similar to the one presently standing in the Saratoga National Historical Park, that brave men stood and fought for their freedom and their beliefs.

The White House is a symbol of our unity; the Pentagon, a symbol of our military might and readiness; the blockhouse, a symbol of a courageous ancestry. Had not the men who fought in the blockhouse been prepared and able to defend their rights, we might still be living under British rule.

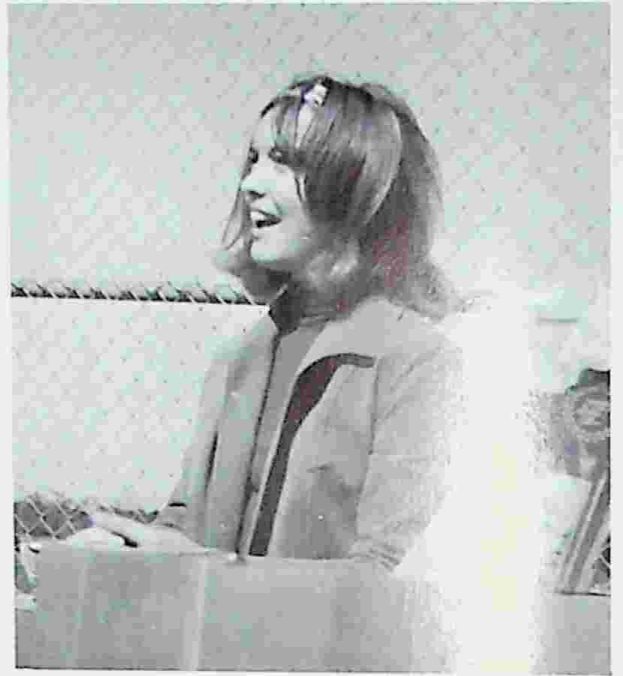

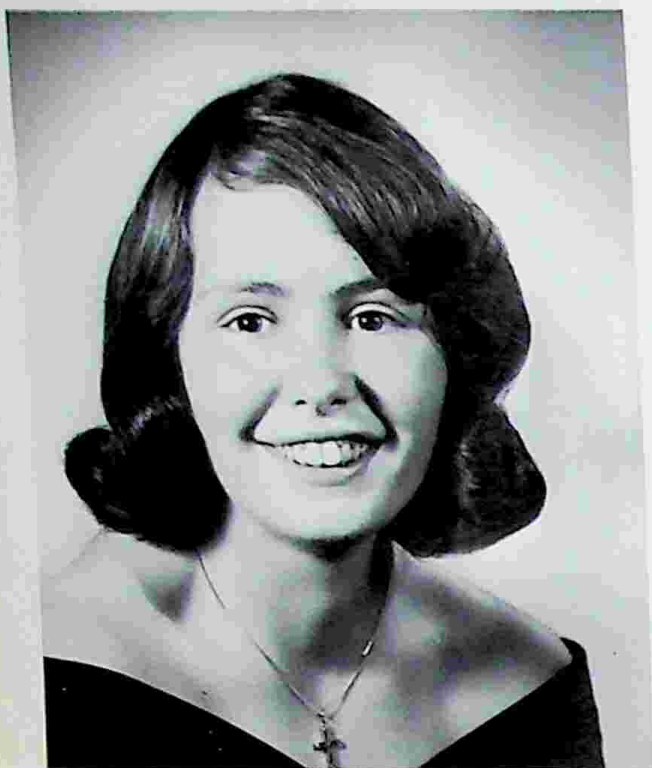
The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America,

When in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a solemn appeal to the Supreme Judge of the world is made, that they will declare the justice of their claims, and the rectitude of their conduct. We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed — That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such Principles, and organizing its Powers in such form, as shall seem to them best to secure the Safety and Happiness of the People. 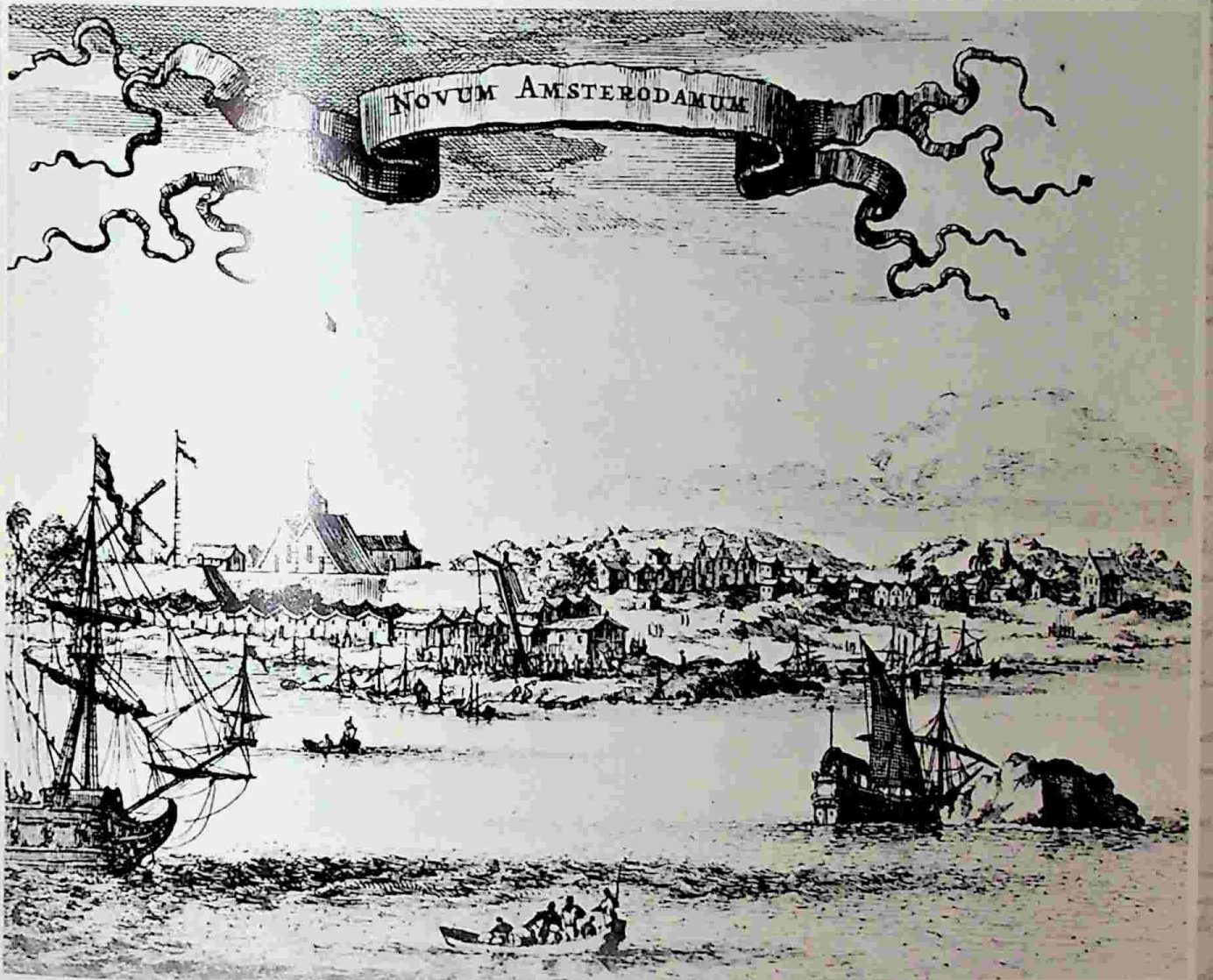
Article I

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when elected shall have been seven Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to all free Persons, including Indians bound to Service, and all male Persons sixteen Years of Age and upwards who shall have become Citizens of the United States, and all other Persons who may be included within this Union, three fifths of the free Persons belonging to each of the said States, the whole Number of free Persons in each State shall be added to three fifths of the free Persons belonging to each of the said States, and the Sum so arrived at, shall be the Basis or Ratio for adding one Representative to every thirty thousand Persons; but no State shall have less Representatives than the Number of Electors in that State; and until such apportionment shall have been made, one Representative shall be chosen from each State until the next Meeting of the Congress.



Section 3. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature of the State for which they are chosen, and they shall hold their Offices for six Years, and until their Successors be chosen; but no Senator shall be chosen for more than two Terms, except he be again chosen the next Year after he shall have so served; and immediately after they shall be chosen, they shall be sworn or affirm to support this Constitution.

No Person shall be a Senator who shall not have attained to the Age of thirty Years, and seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when elected shall have been seven Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.

Section 4. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of confirming and rejecting all Appointments of the President, and all Officers of the United States, which shall have been proposed to them by the President; and also of advising and consenting to all Treaties, and ratifying and rejecting all Treaties which shall have been proposed to them by the President.

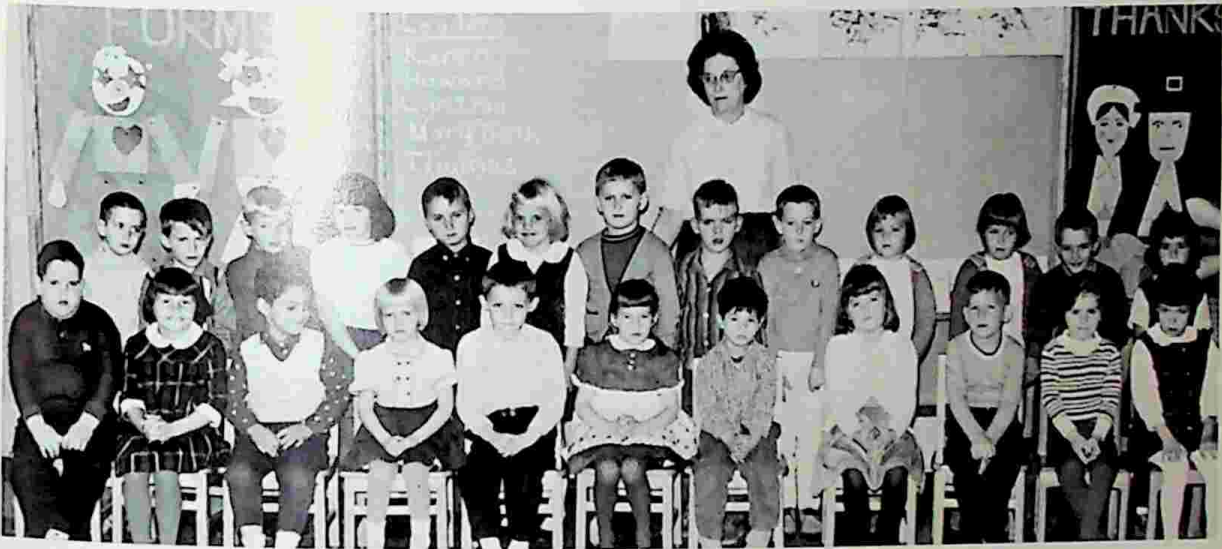

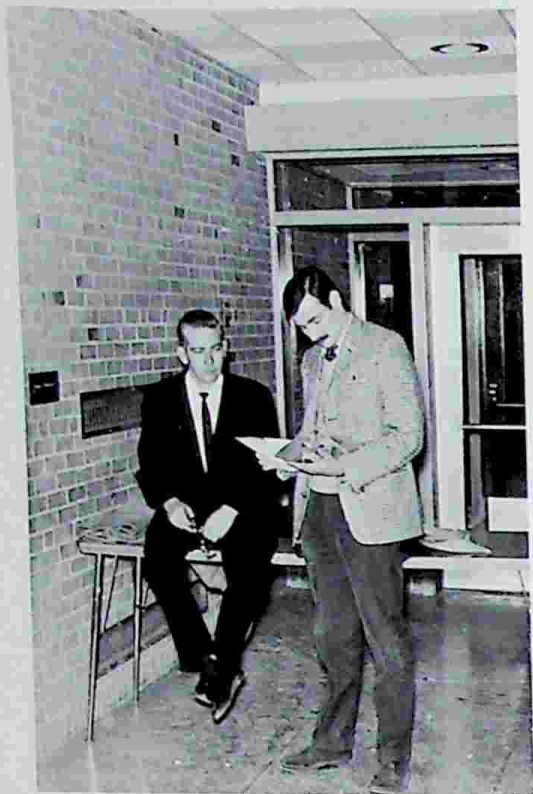

The National Honor Society and the Student Council are two of the most important organizations in our school; for their membership is composed of those students who are the scholars and the leaders of the student body.

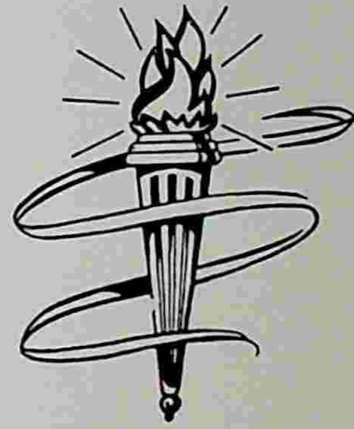

The Senior Band is one of the most active organizations in our school. Many hours of practice have produced a fine band of which the citizens of Stillwater can be proud.

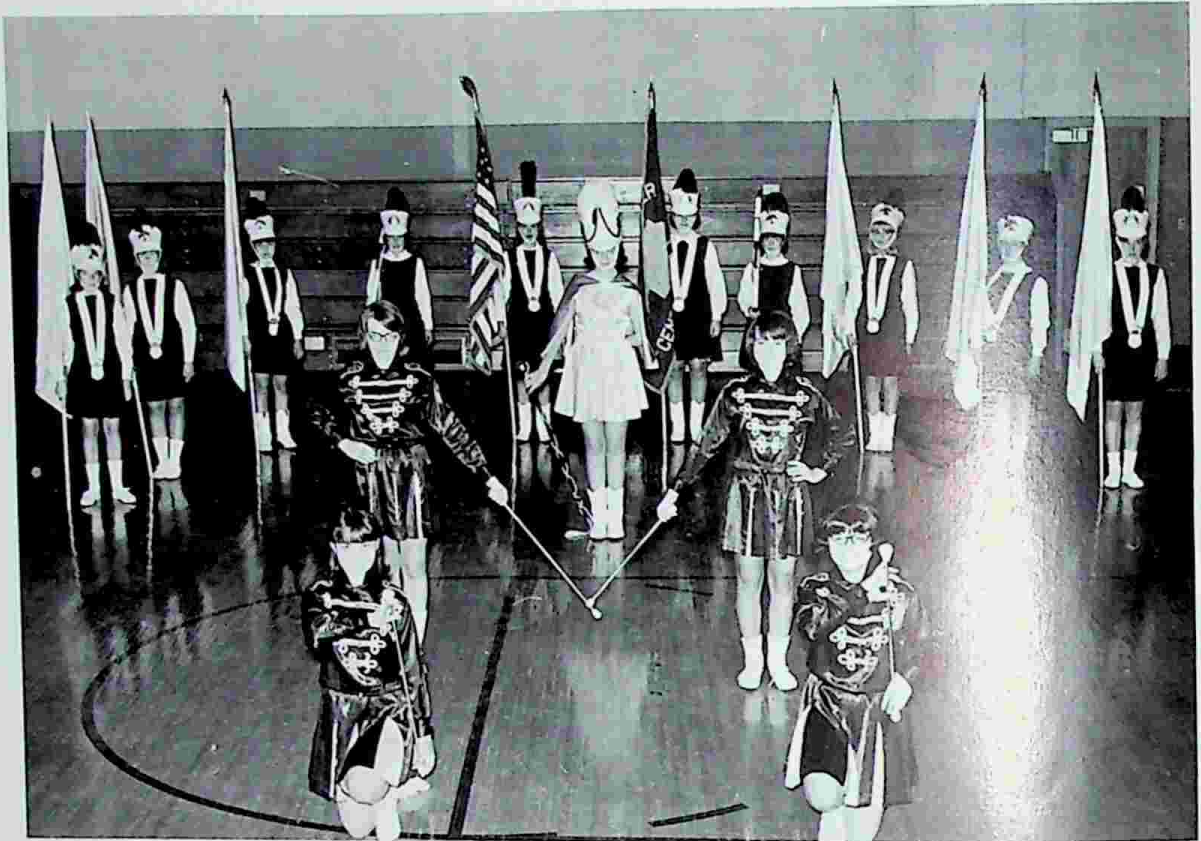
They have performed at the New York World's Fair where they were graciously welcomed. They also perform at many school and local functions.

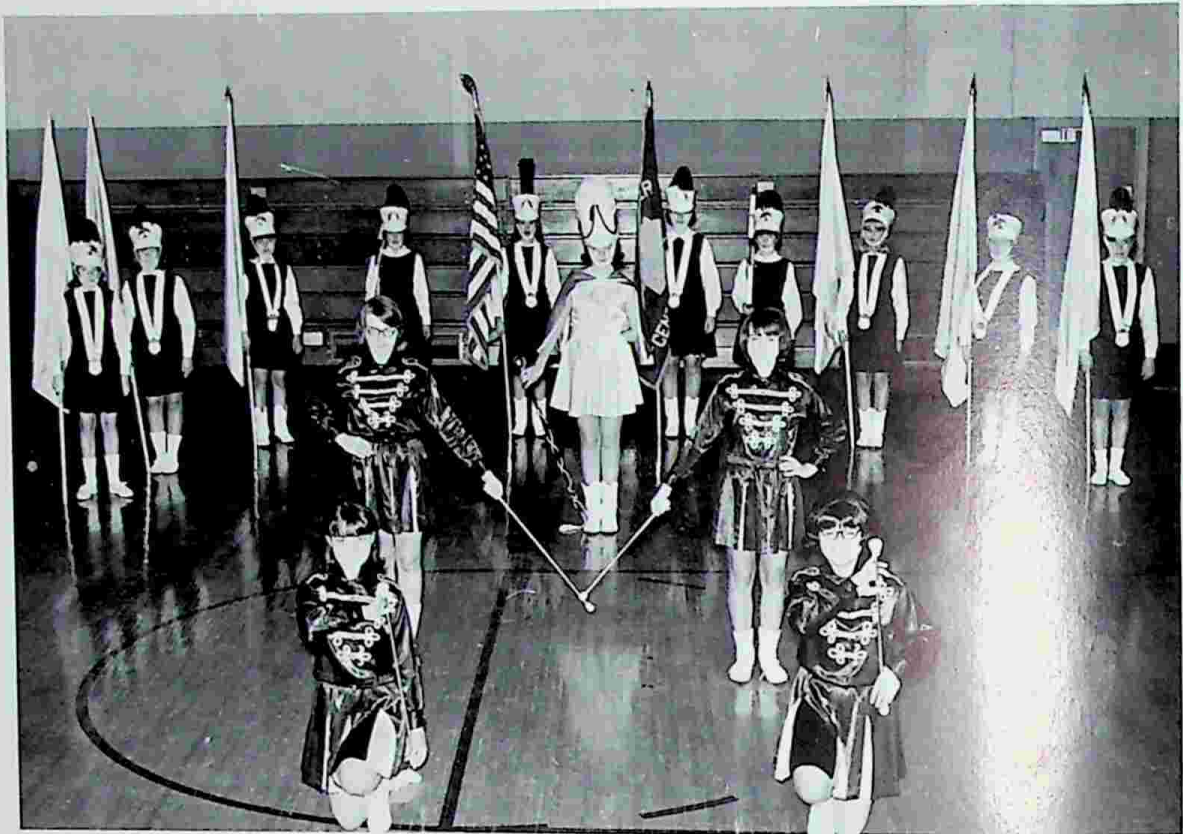

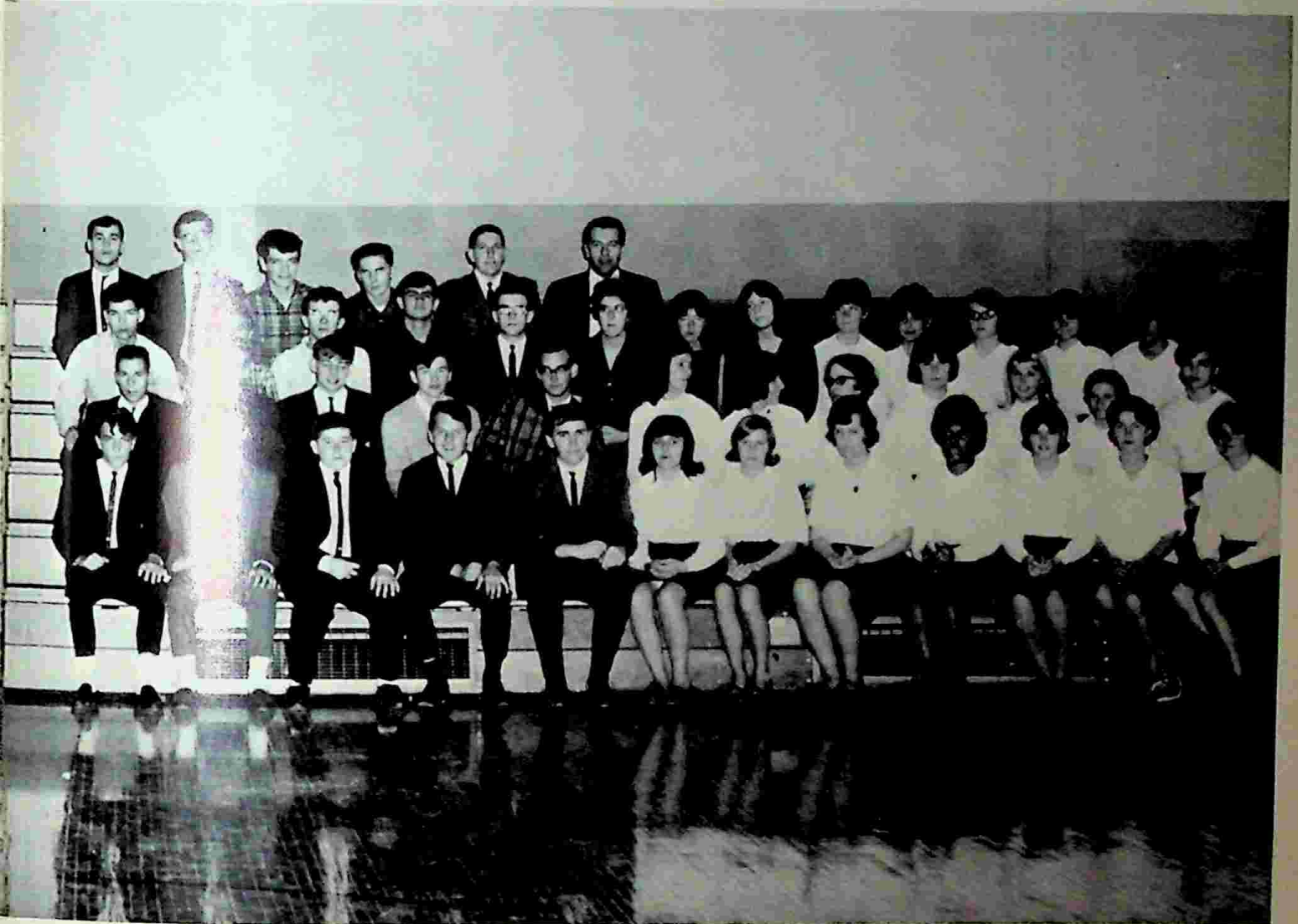
The Senior Chorus has been under the direction of Mr. Sprague for the past two years. During this time the membership has grown to approximately ninety-five students.

For the members of the Washington Club, one of the highlights of the Senior Year was spending four days in Washington, followed by two days in New York.

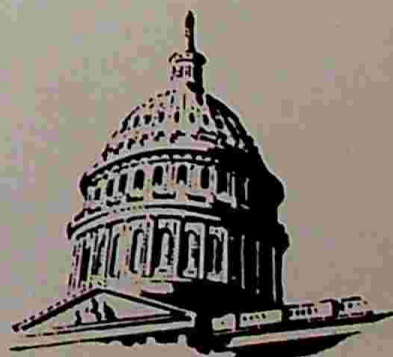

On their way to New York City, they passed down the main street of Philadelphia, where they saw Independence Hall and the Liberty Bell.

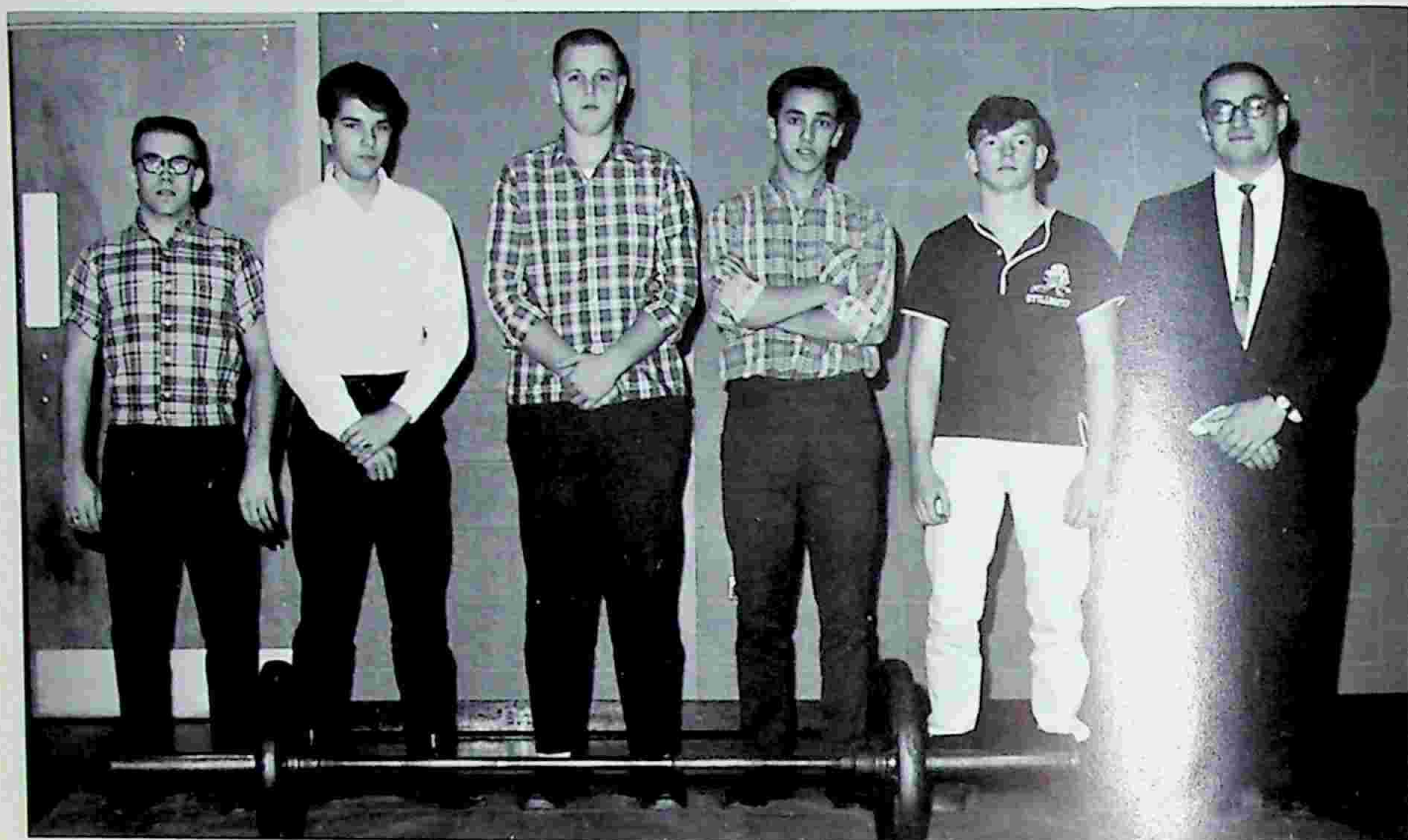
In New York City, they took a tour which included the Statue of Liberty, Lower Manhattan, Radio City, and the United Nations building.

Some of the money necessary for this trip was earned by the members through the sale of cards, magazines, candy, and food; as well as from the proceeds of dances and roller skating parties.

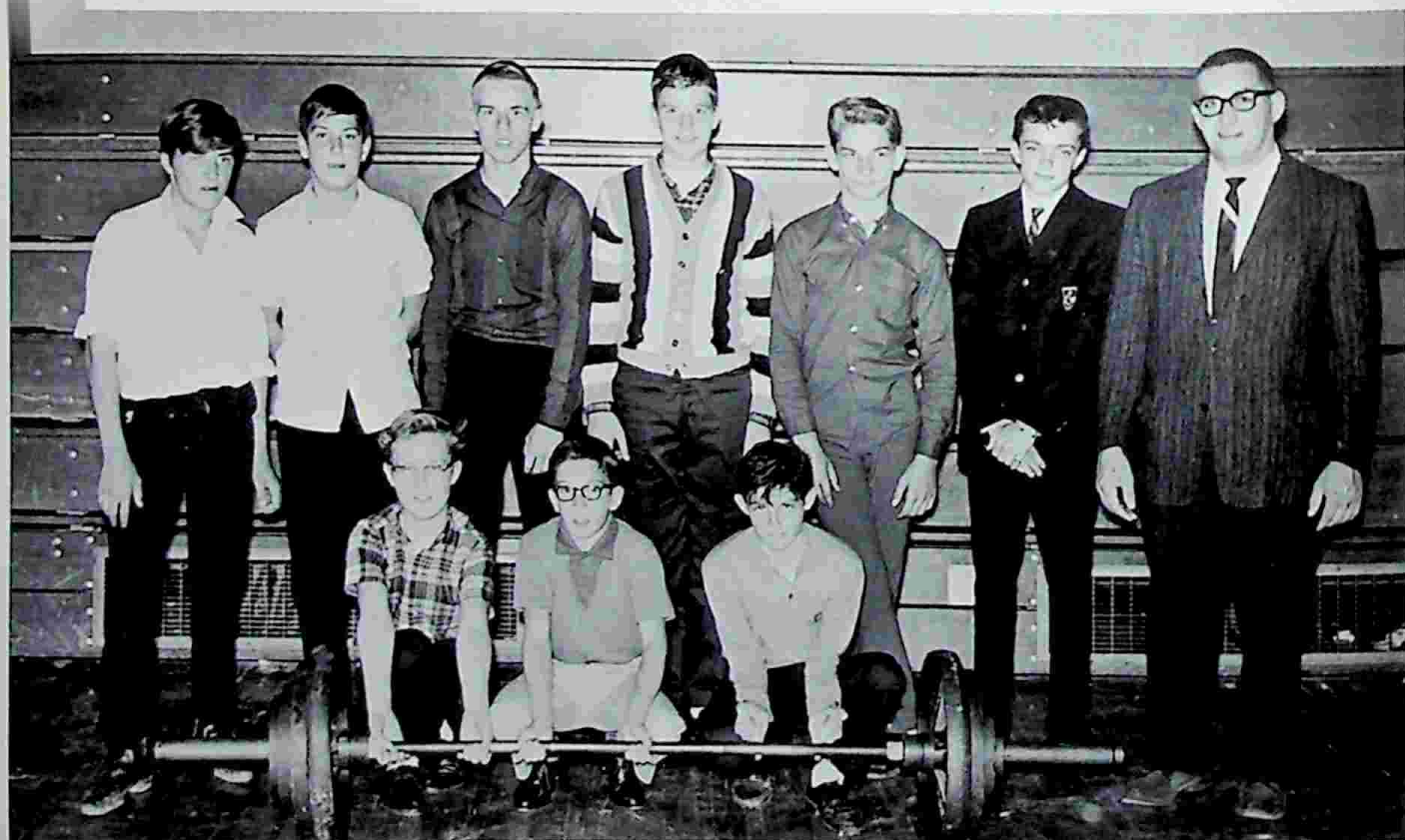

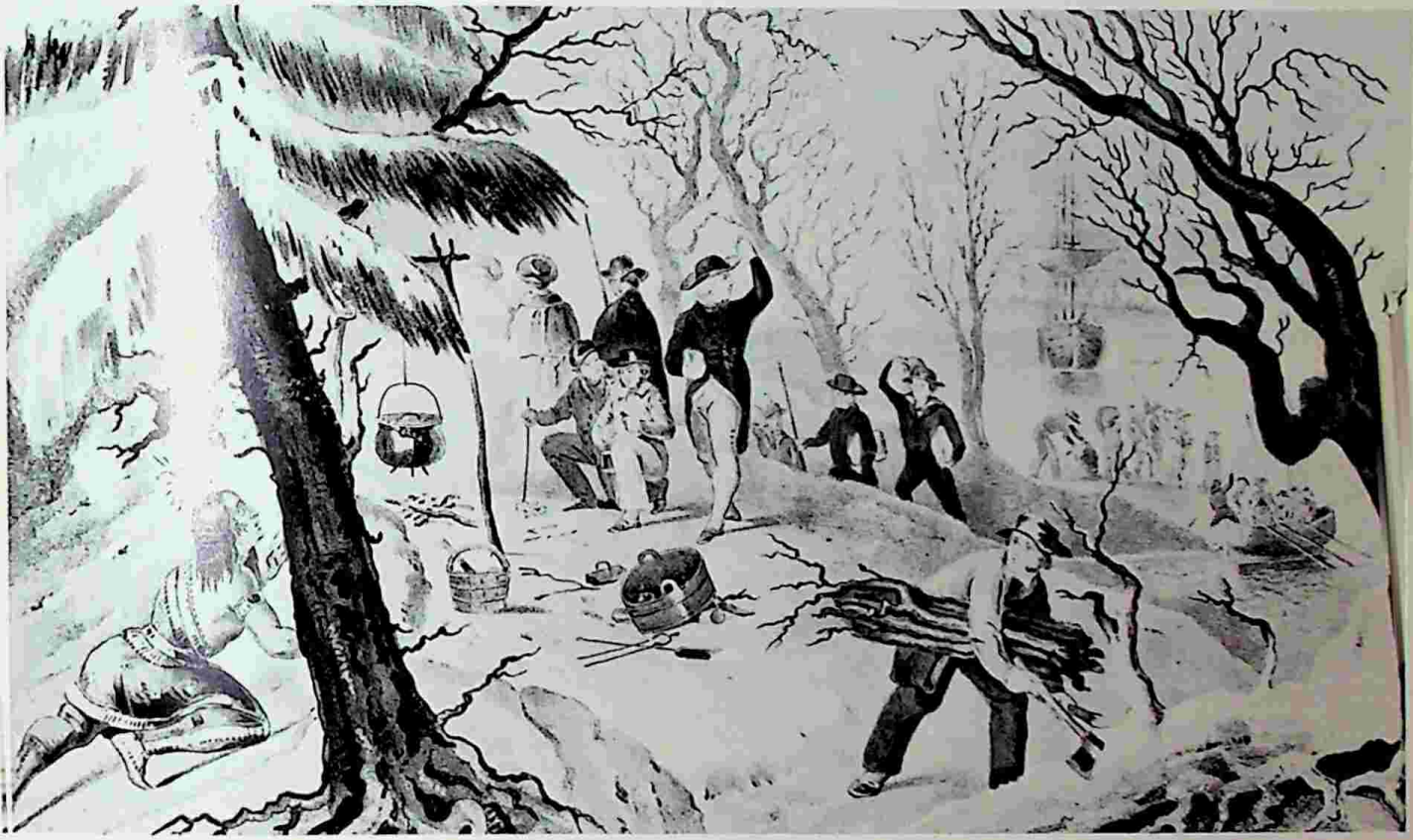

'65 — Football Team





Encouraging aspects for future years were the performances of the underclassmen and the fine junior high football team.

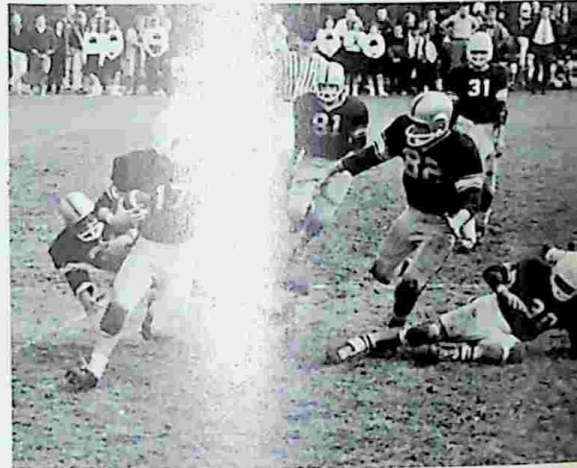

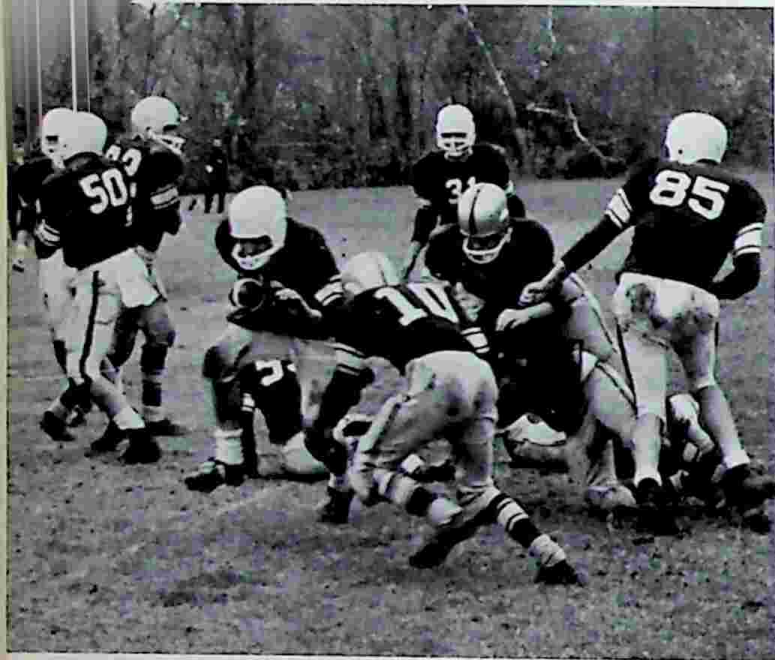

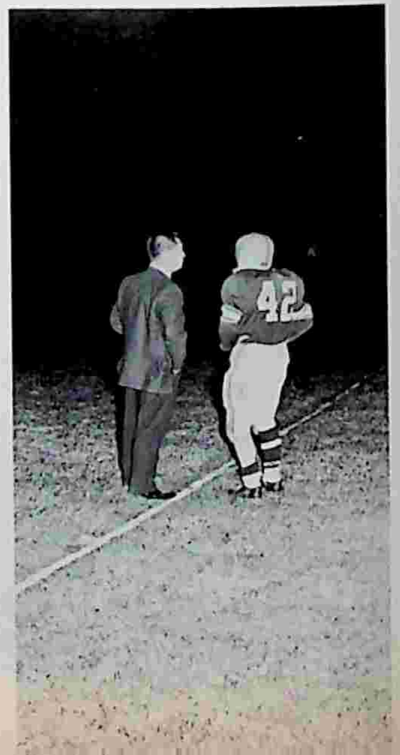

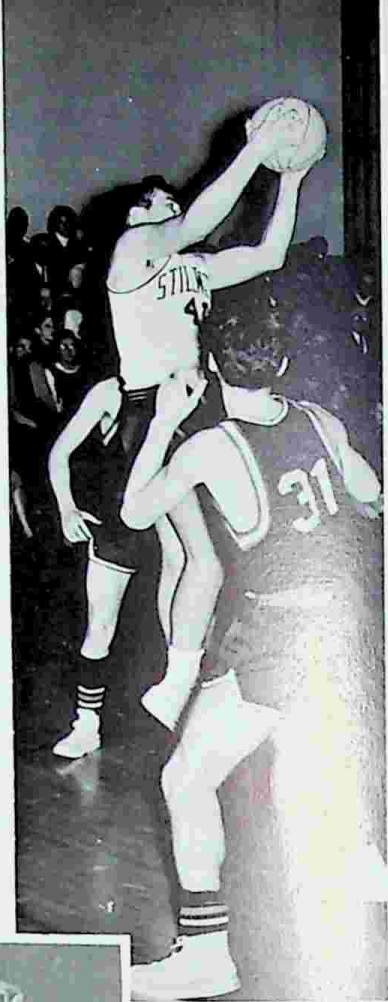

The outlook for the 1966-67 season will be brighter with many of this year's team returning, and a good group of eighth grade boys moving up to help.



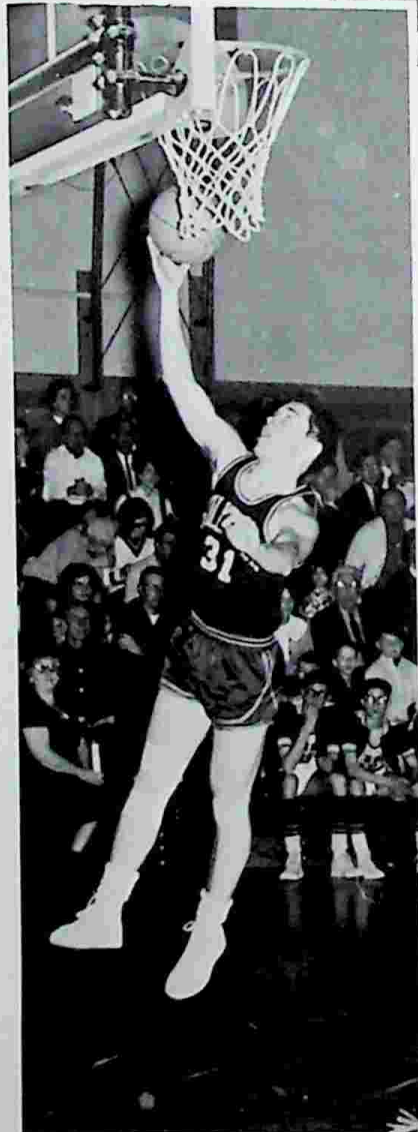

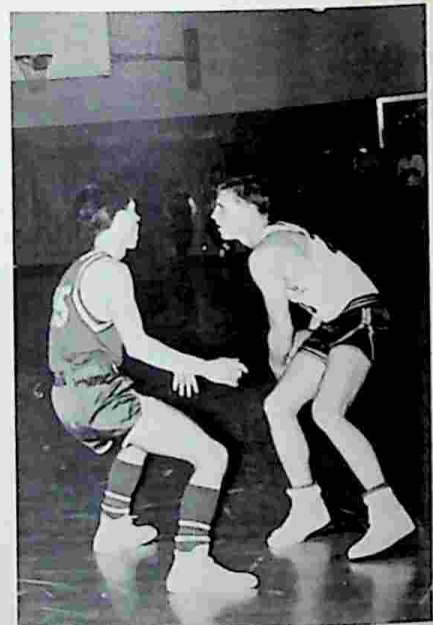

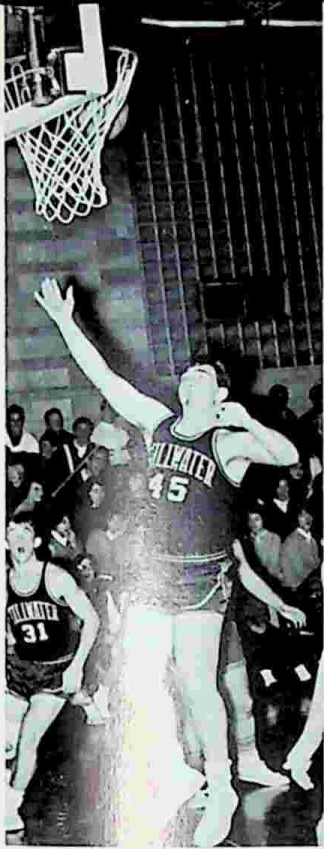
