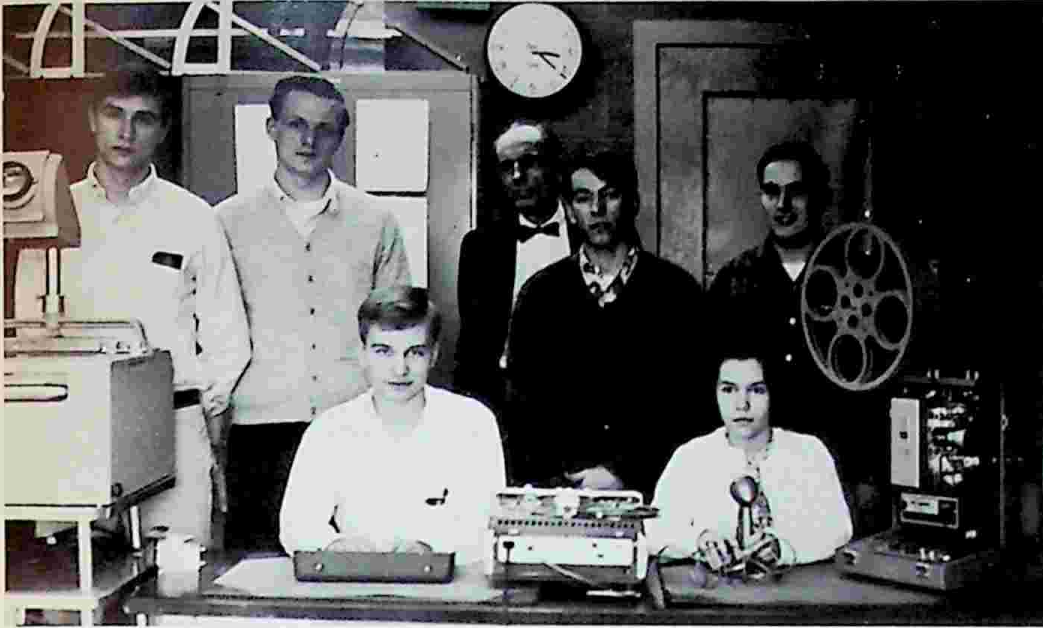
# The Warrior Staff

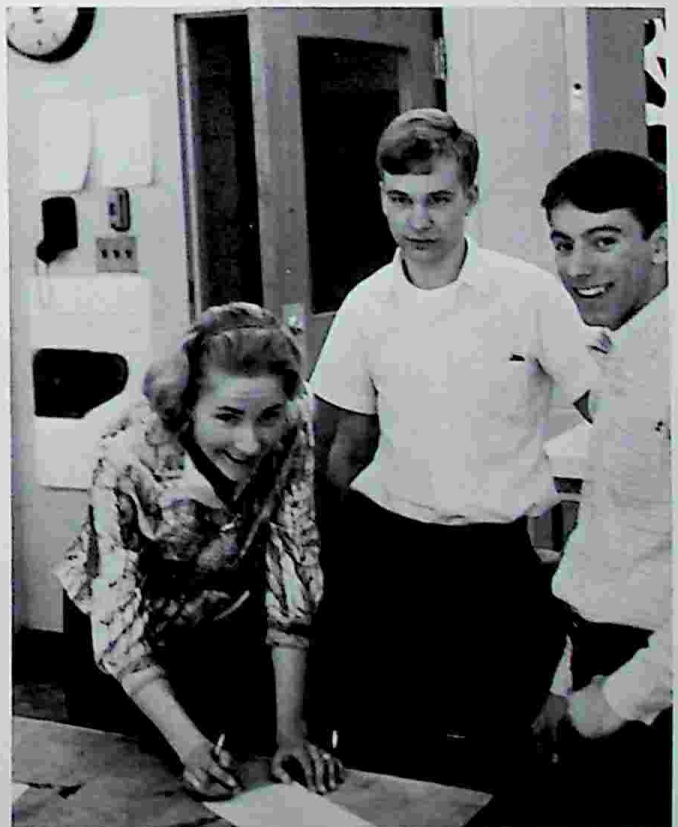
## *Audio-Visual Club*

## Warriors

The 1967 football season proved to be a season in which the Stillwater Warriors fought their way to a number of well-earned victories. The team opened the season on their own home ground in a game against Hoosick Falls. In spite of a fine showing in the second half of the game, in which the Warriors outplayed their opponents 12 to 6, the team's nervous defensive action during the first half of the game proved fatal. Unfortunately, the Hoosiers won, 26 to 13.
