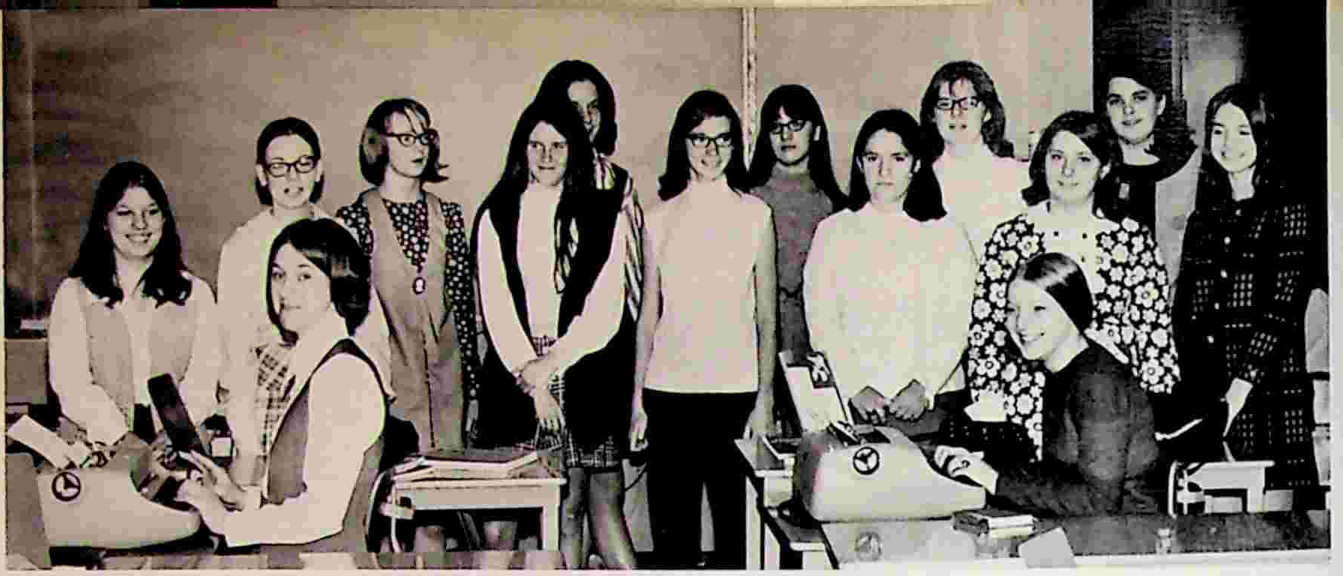
## Honor Society

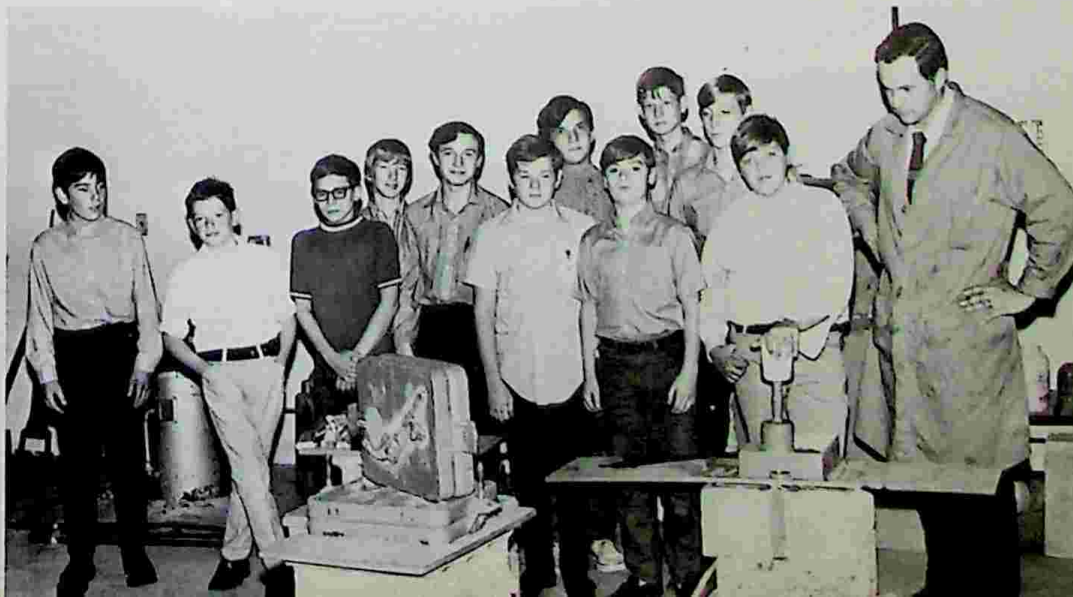


## *Future Farmers*

## Newspaper Club

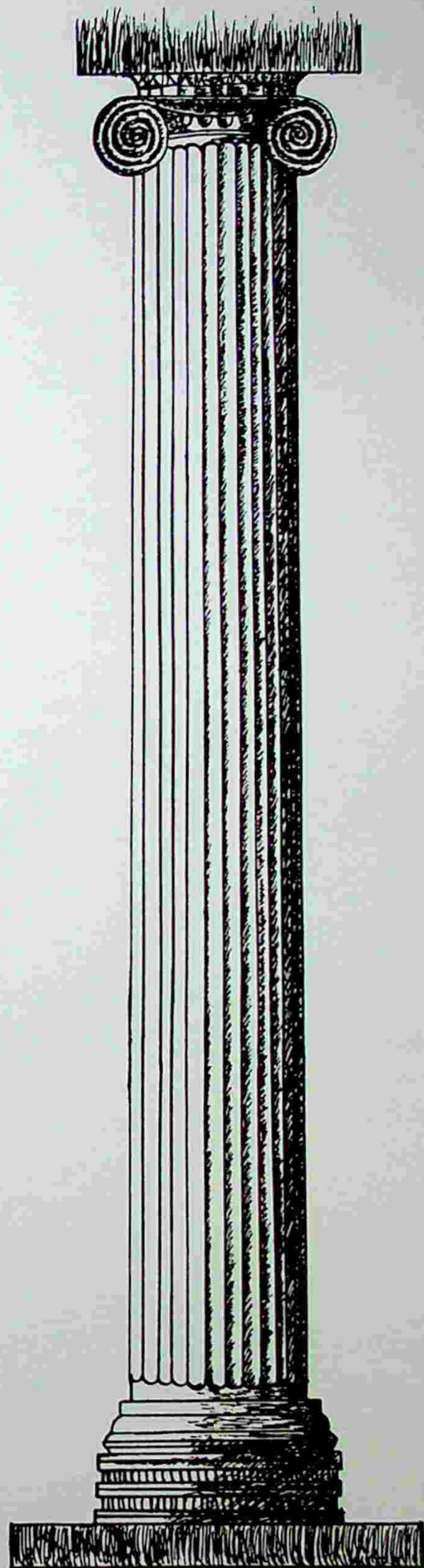

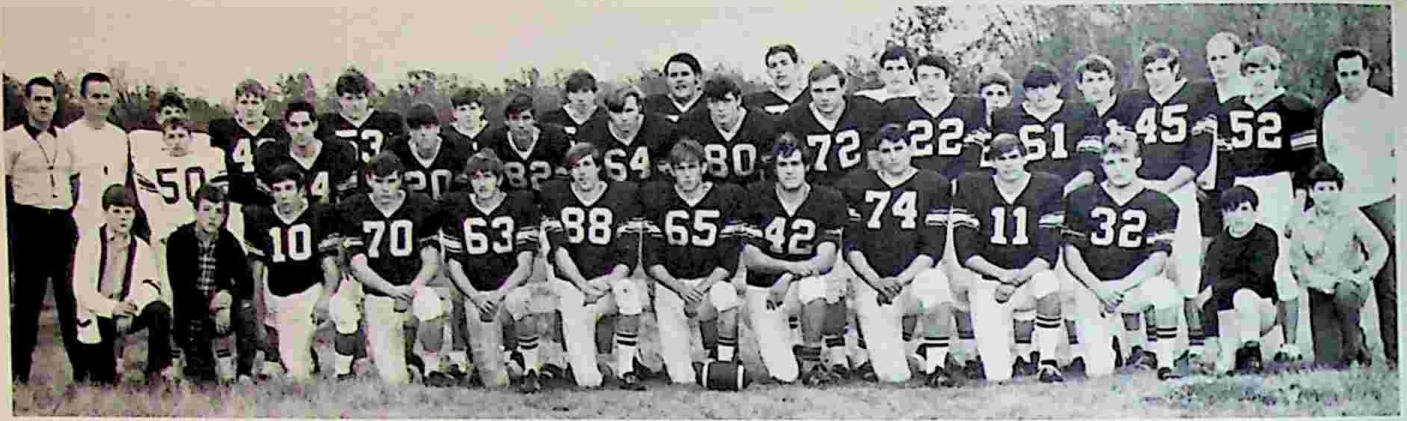
## Audio-Visual Club

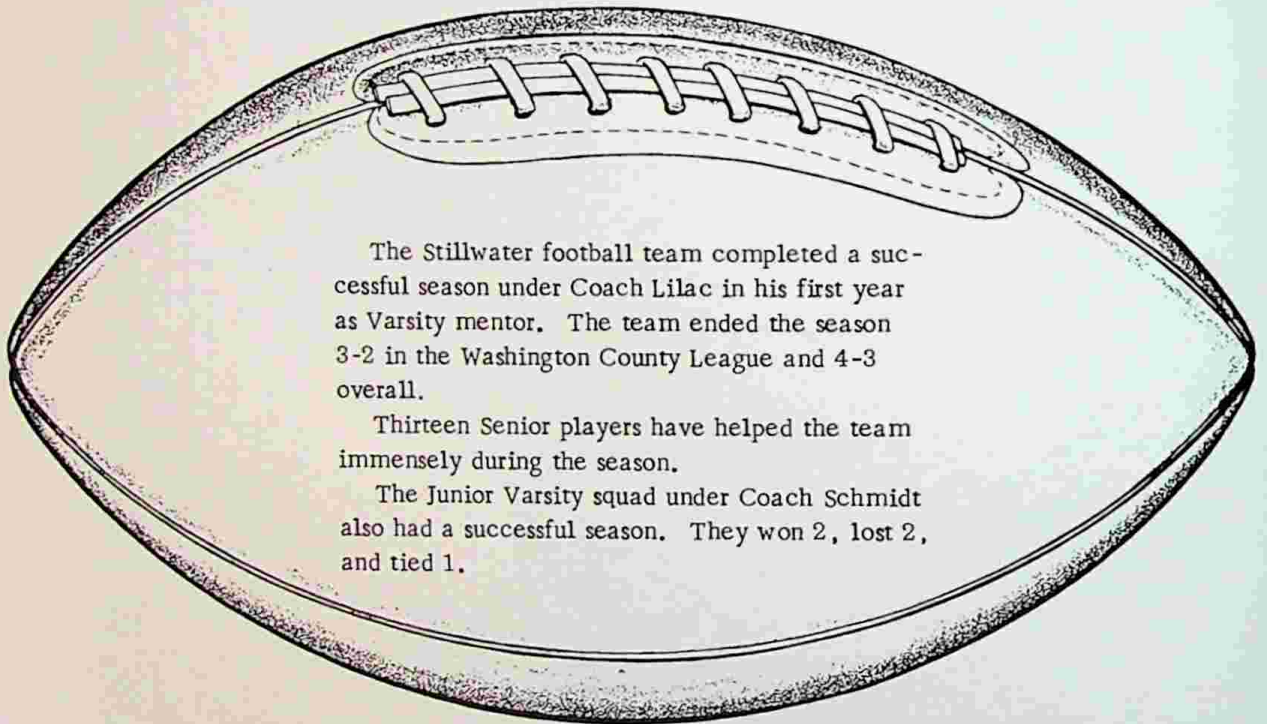

Thirteen Senior players have helped the team immensely during the season.

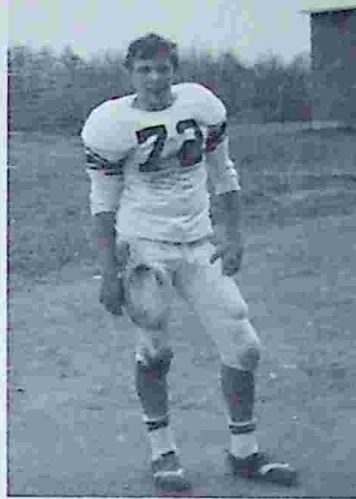
The Junior Varsity squad under Coach Schmidt also had a successful season. They won 2, lost 2, and tied 1.

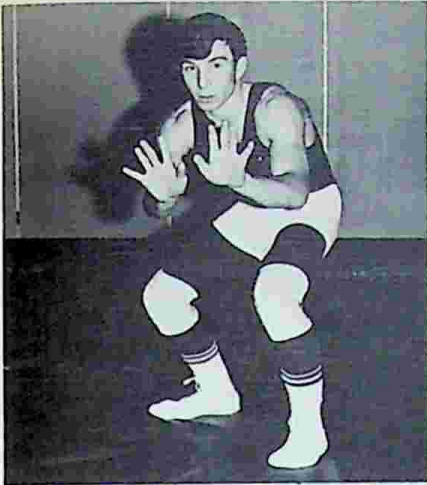
Stillwater Central's track team ended its season as the "winningest" team in the school's history.

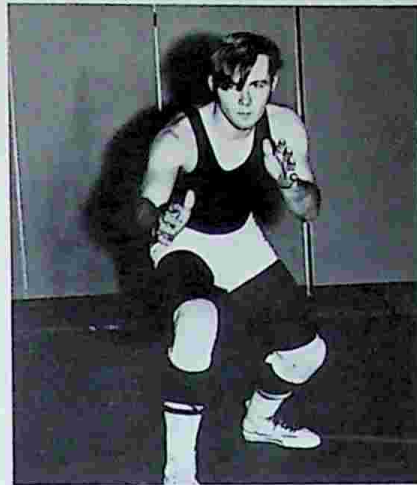
The team competed in the sectionals, winning the Section D - 880 relay and the 100 yard dash. From there the winners progressed to the Section II finals at Mont Pleasant.

With many members of last year's team returning, the Warriors should have plenty of potential to win and set new records this year.

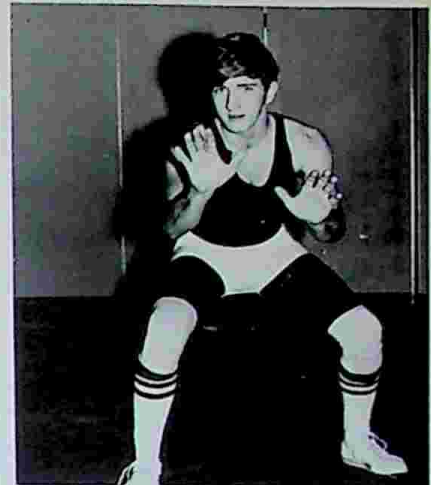

## Girls' Leaders Club

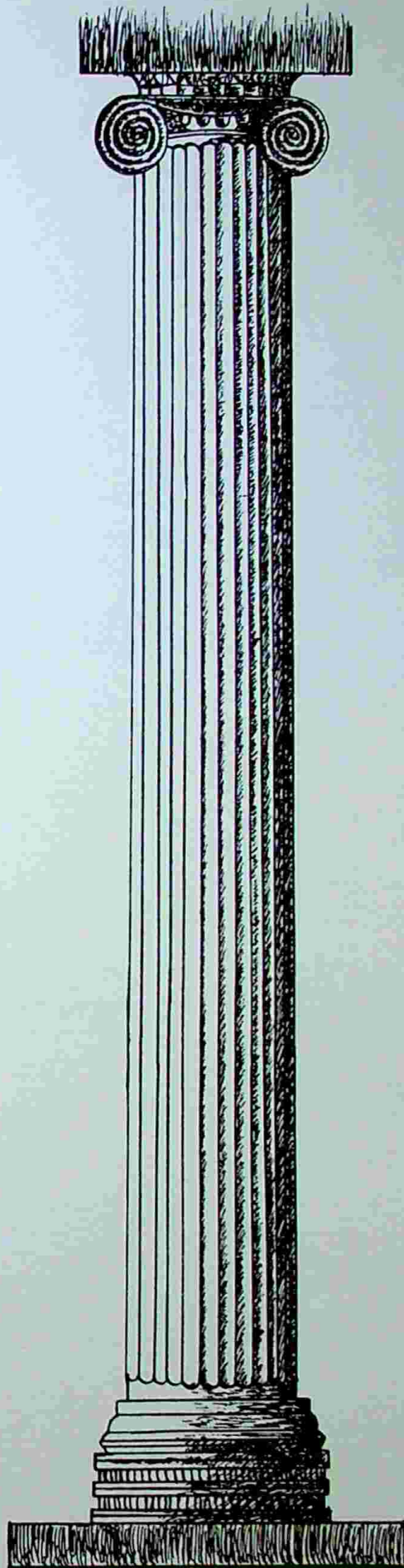
The Leaders Club consists of those girls chosen by their advisor, Mrs. Broad. Before being selected, each of the girls is considered on the basis of her leadership qualities.
