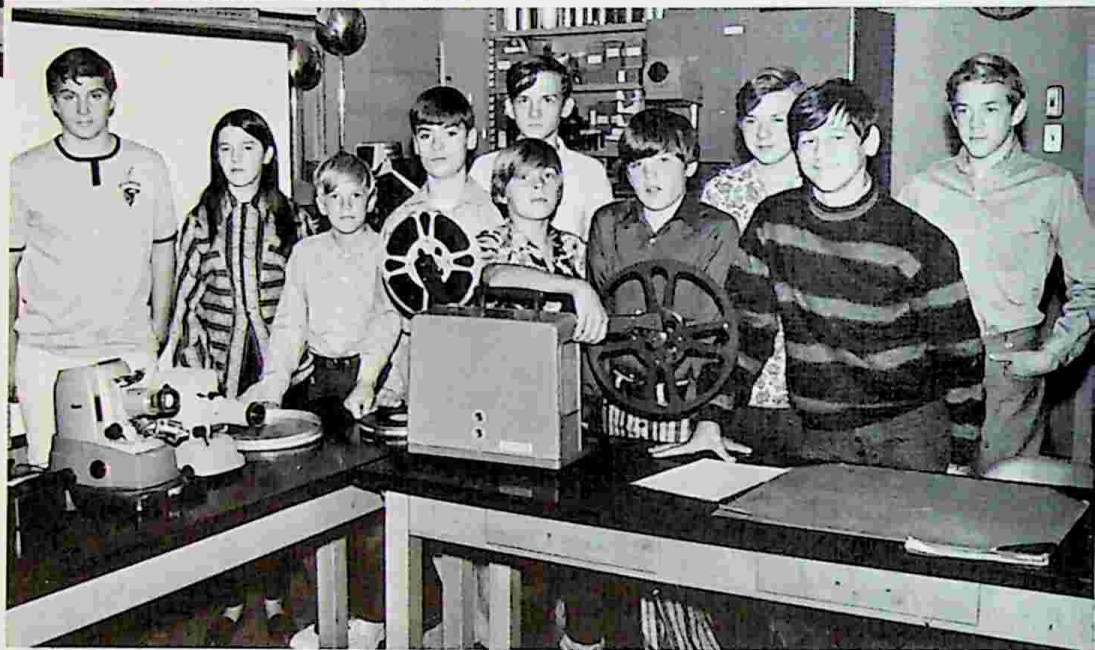






## AUDIO VISUAL CLUB

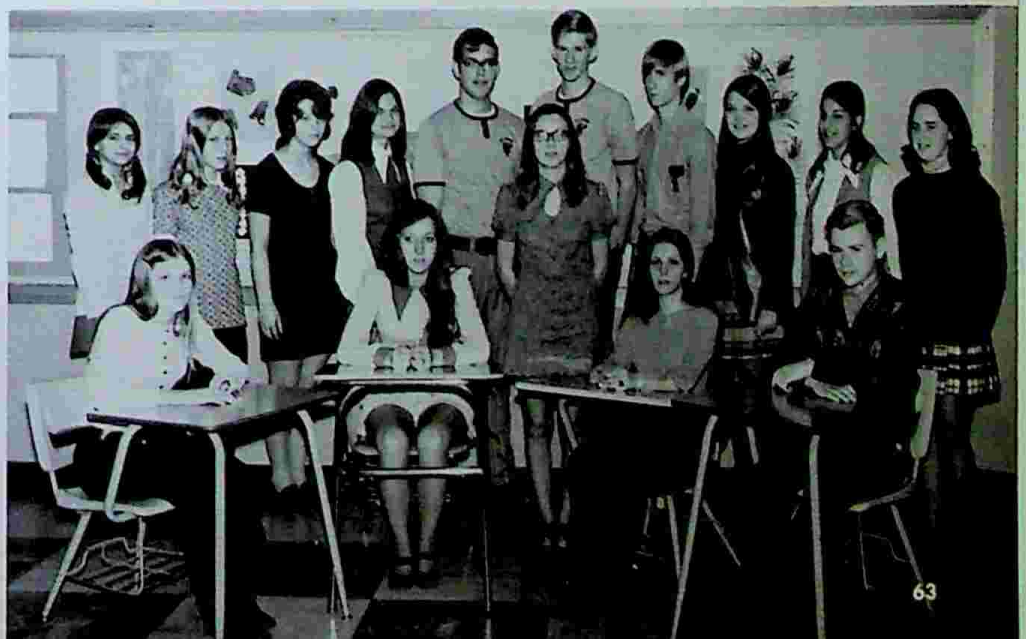
This year their activities were to organize teams to send to the Sports Days, to aid with the pep rallies, and to hold a pie sale at Thanksgiving time.

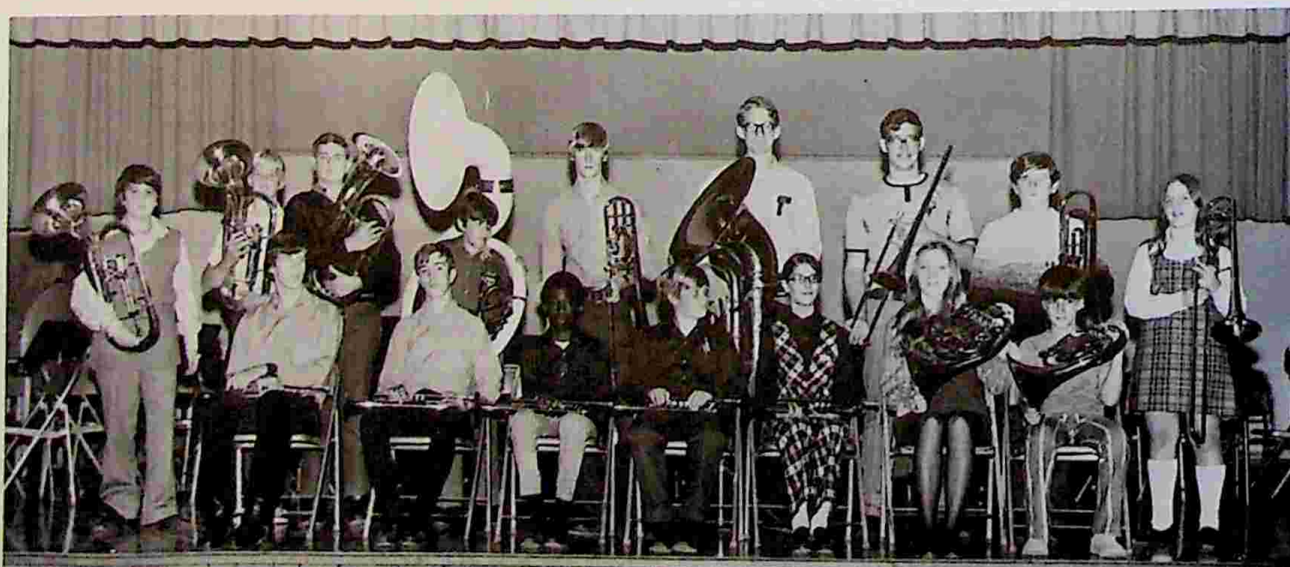
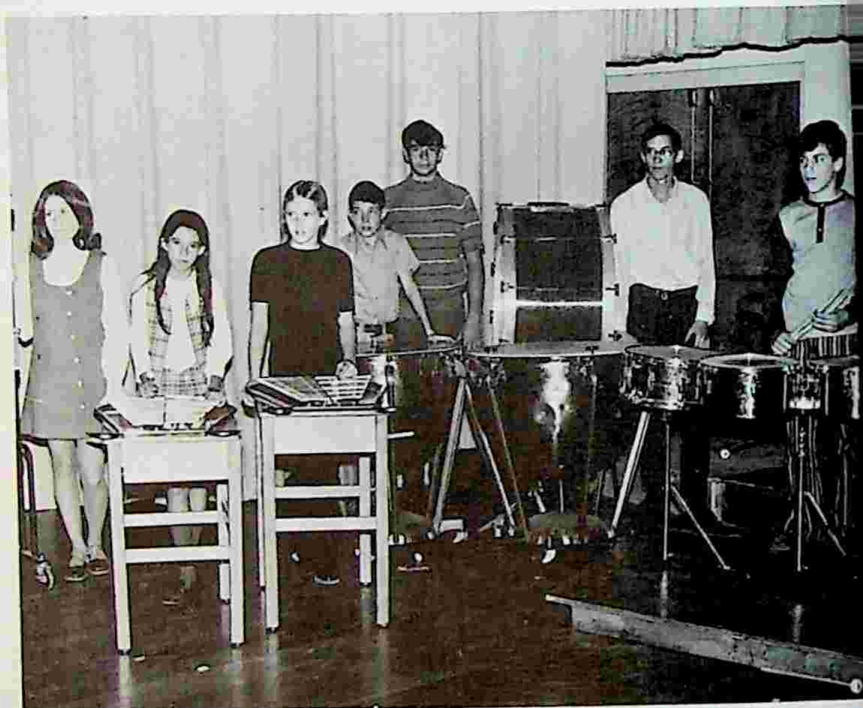


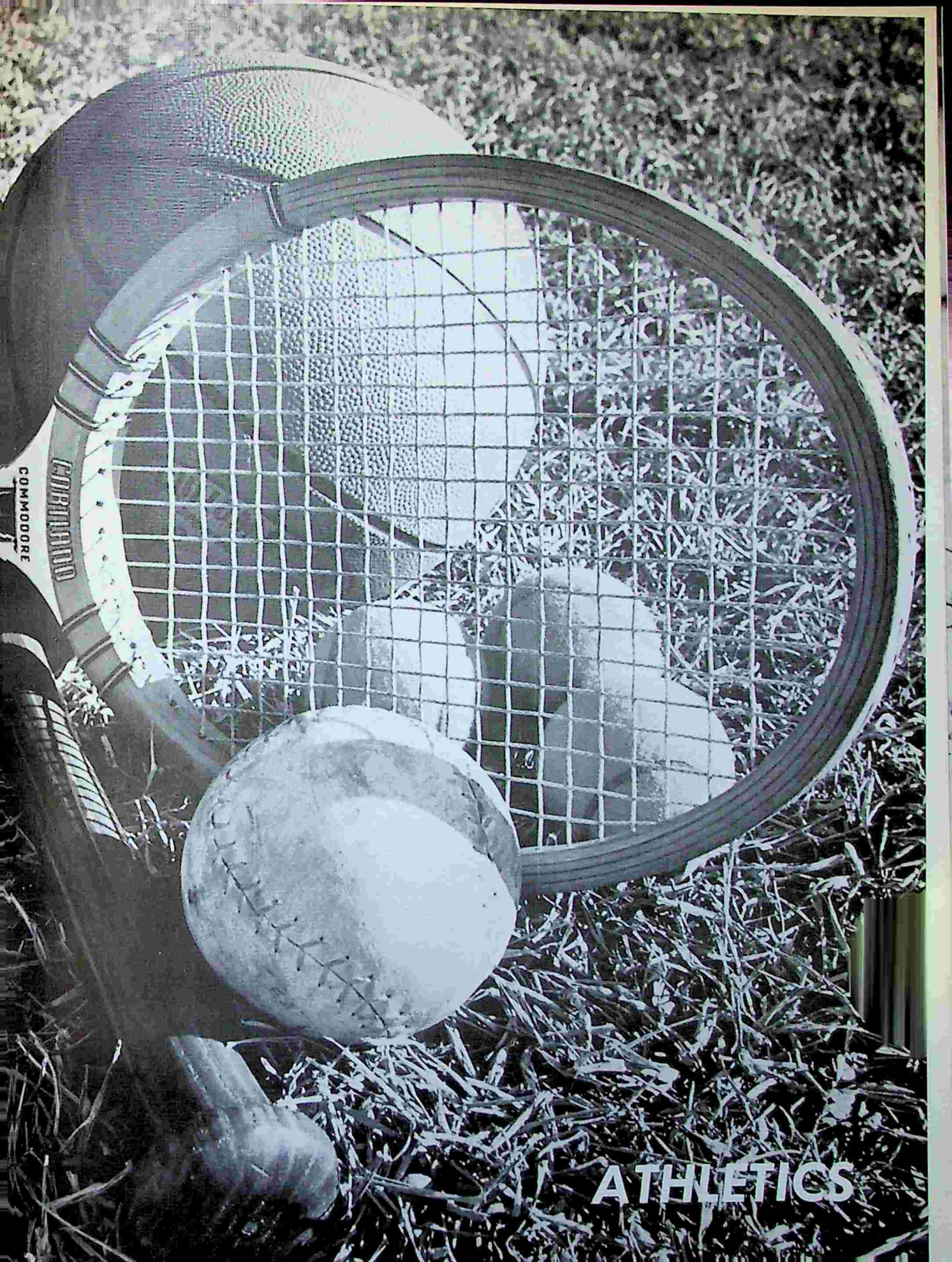
## SENIOR BAND
