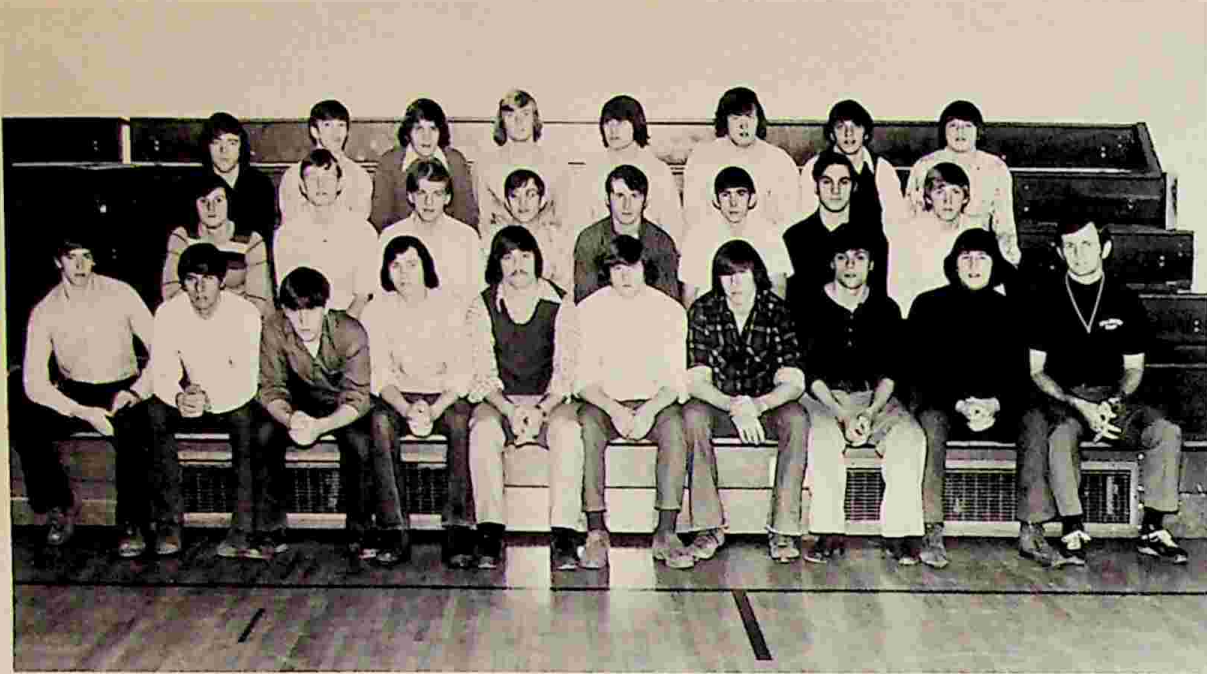


## Math Club

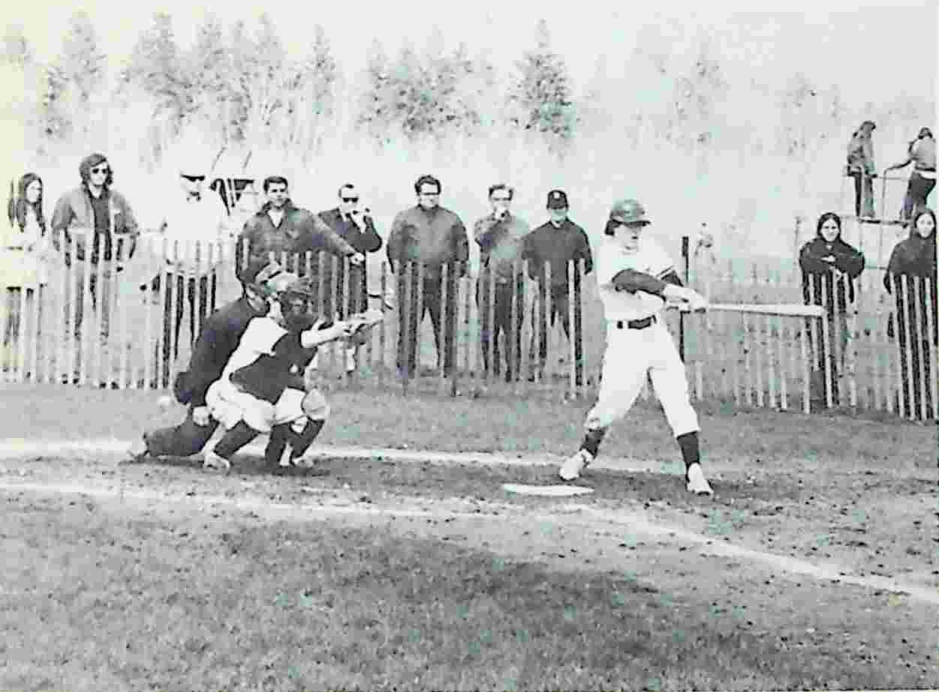


## Varsity Baseball Team
