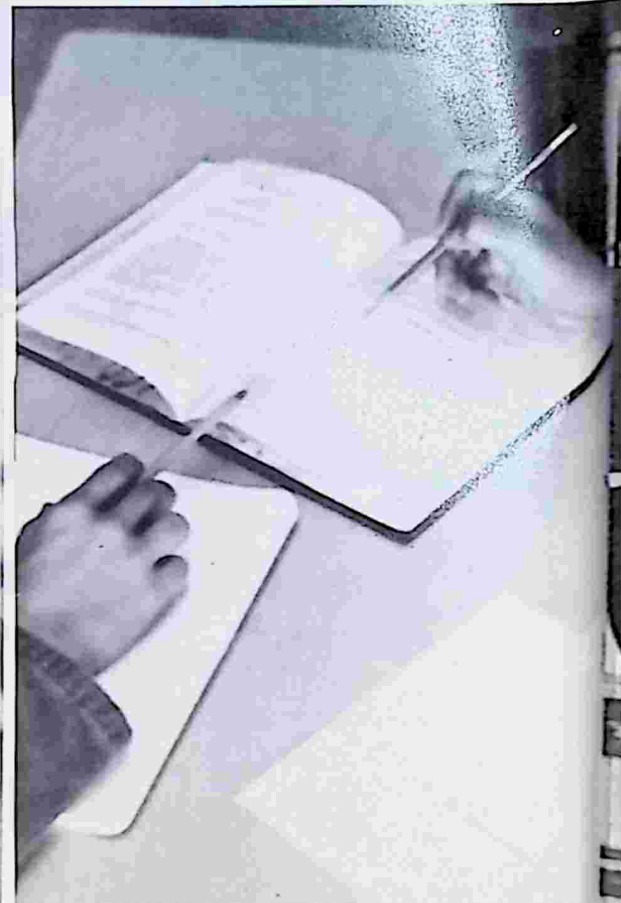
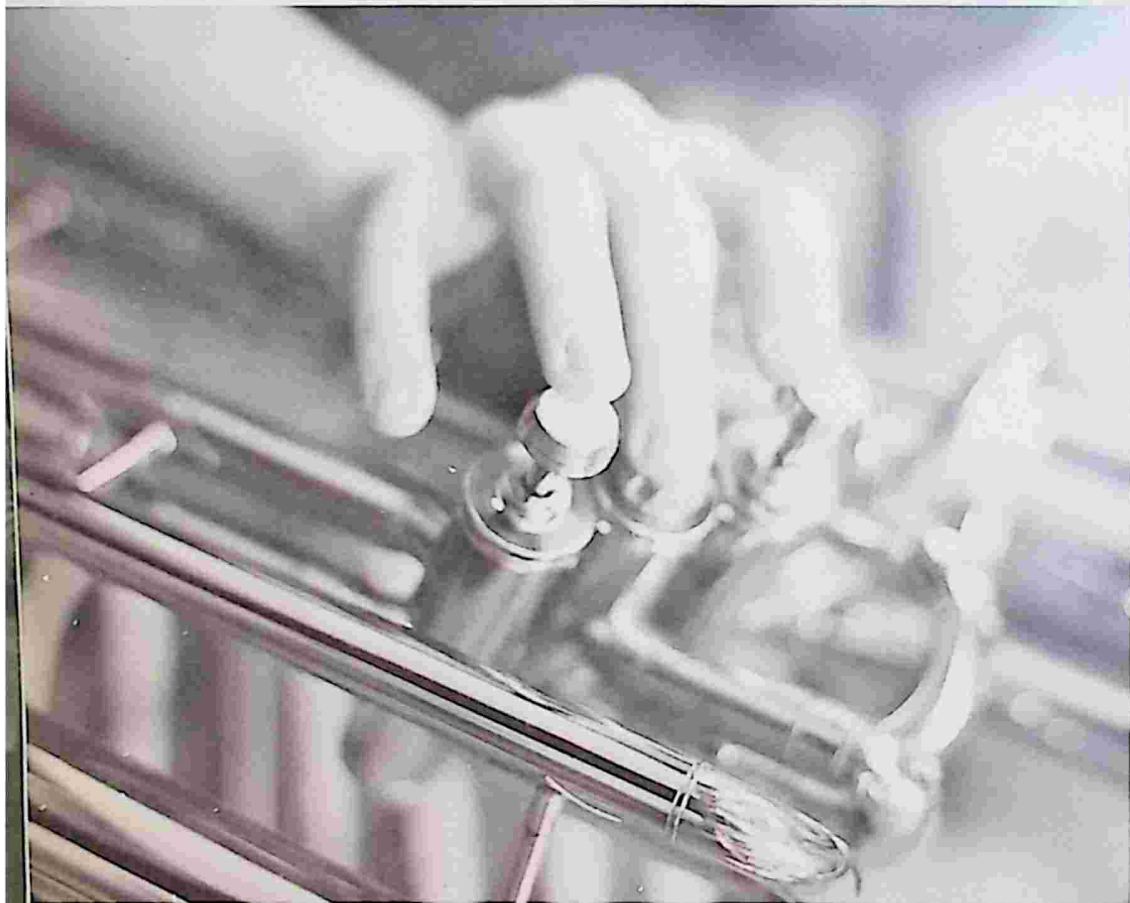
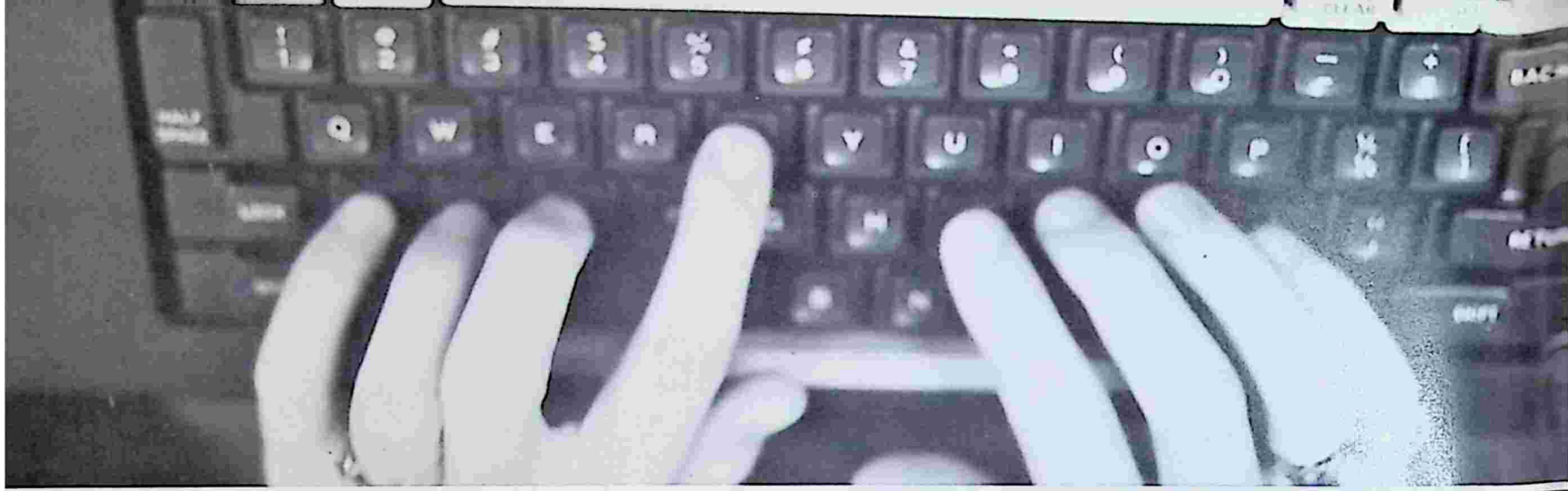
When we were freshmen, we entered high school with a

The Paris Group

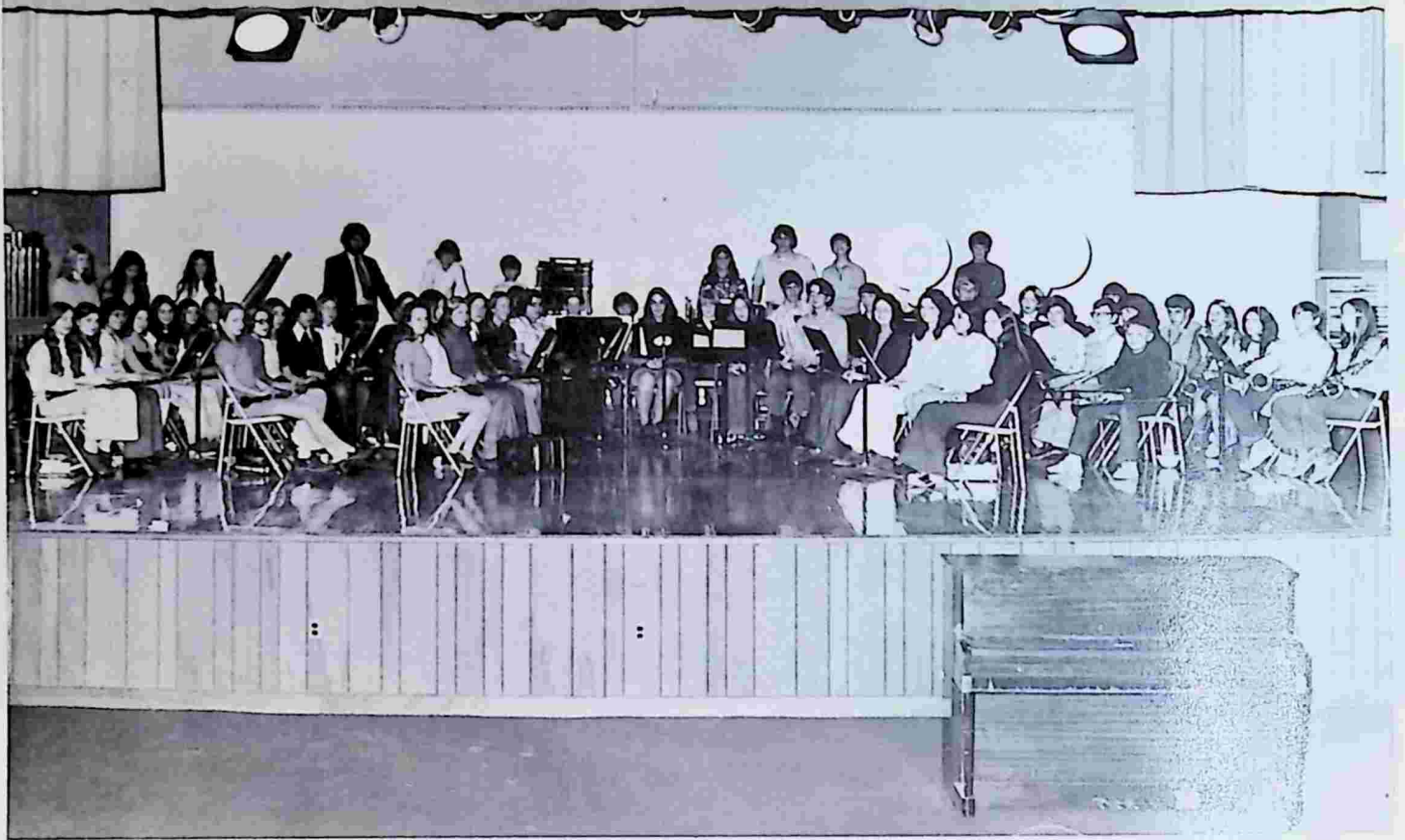

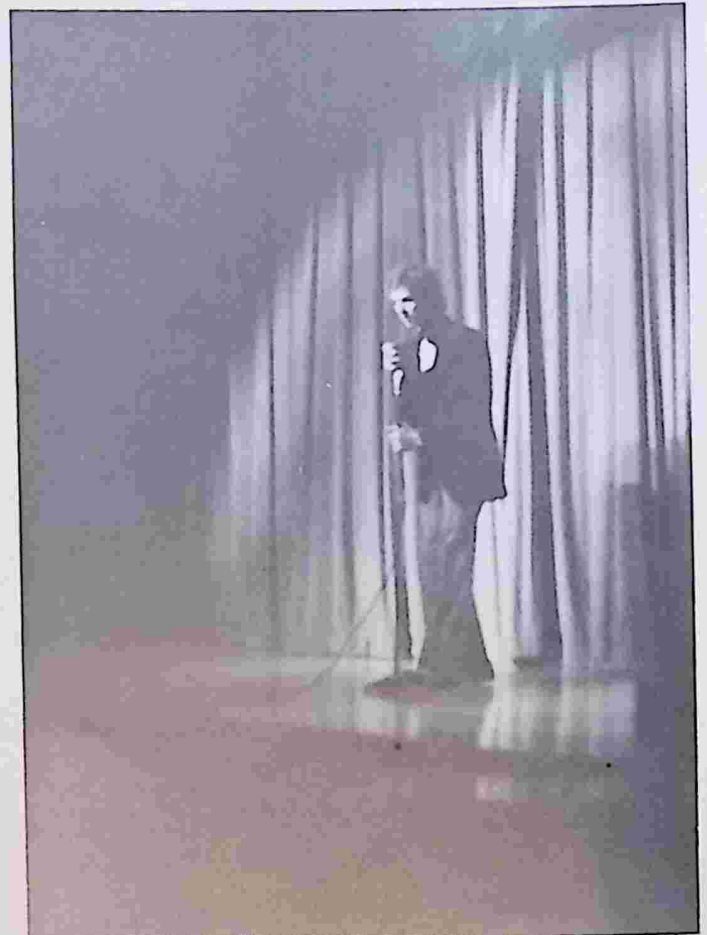


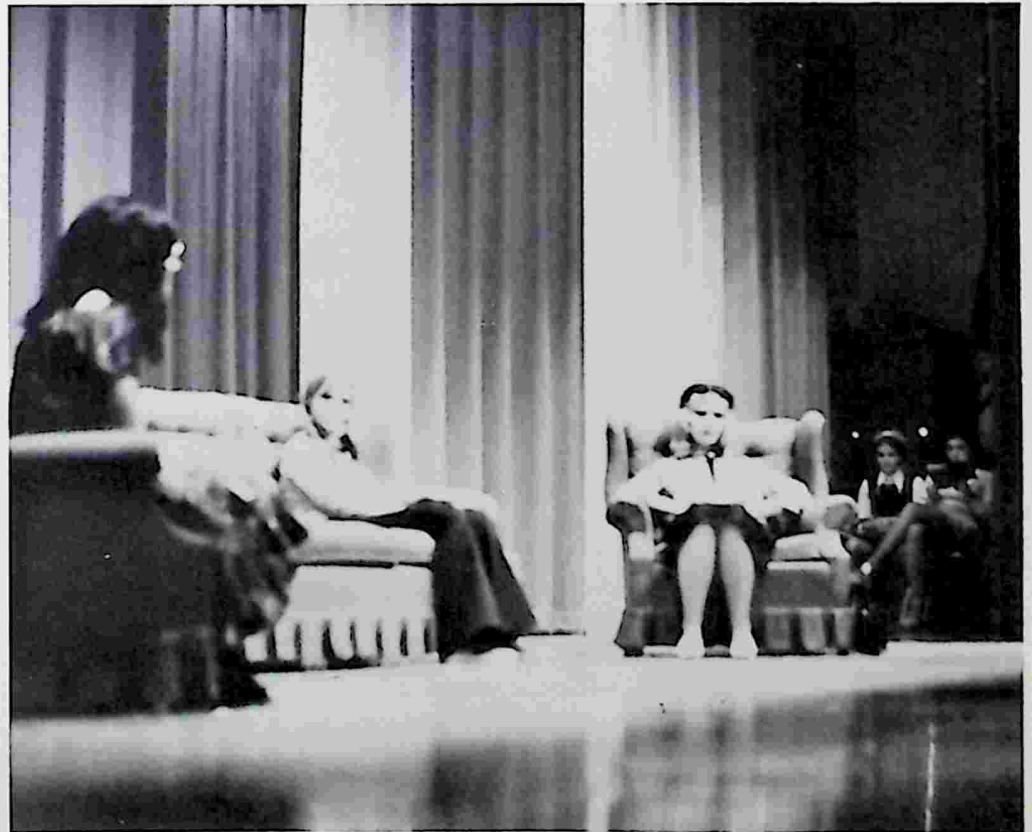


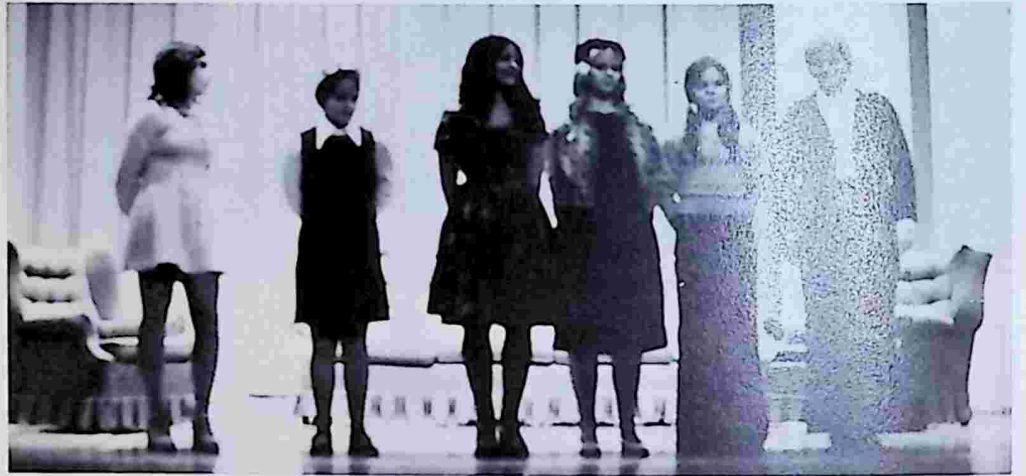


Dramatics Club

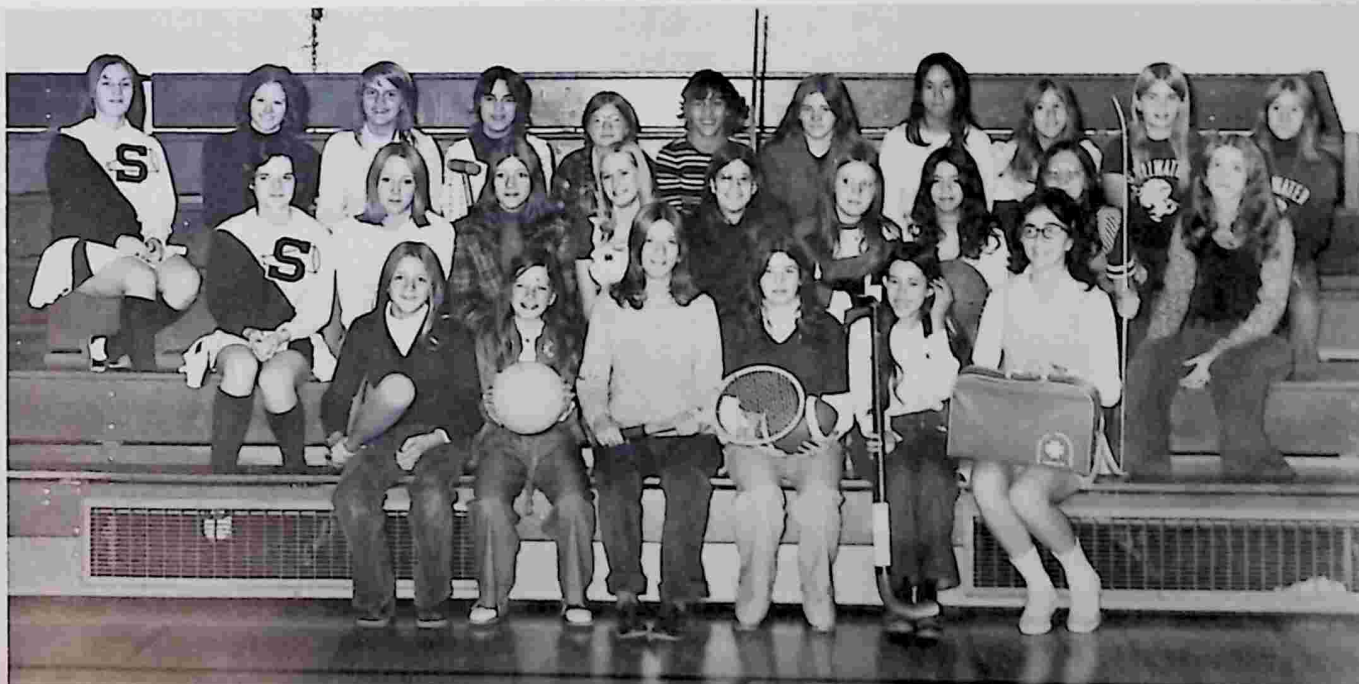

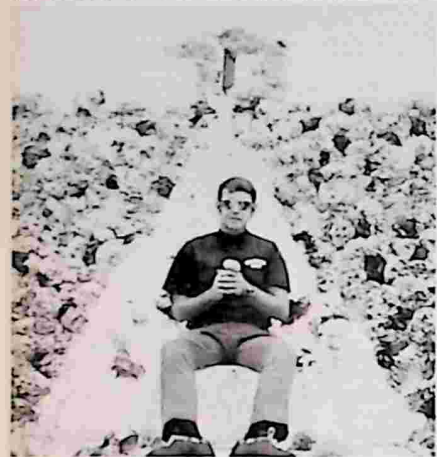
Varsity Club

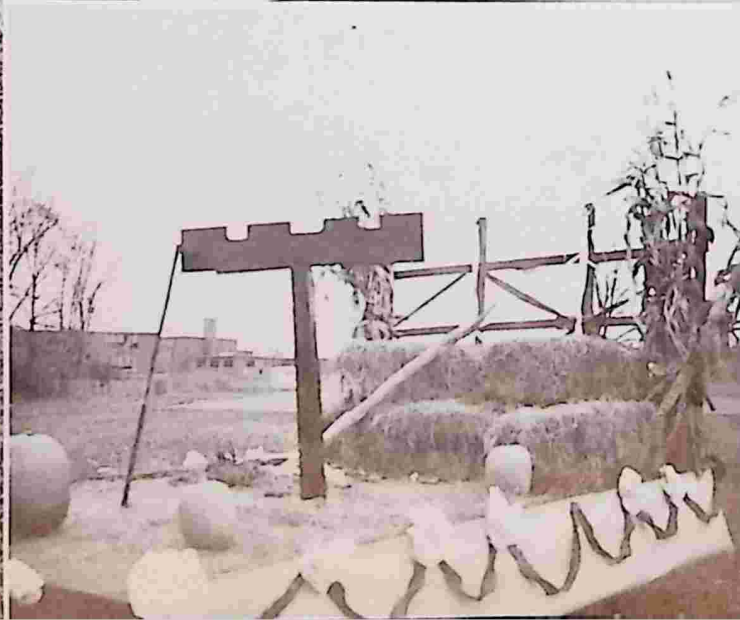
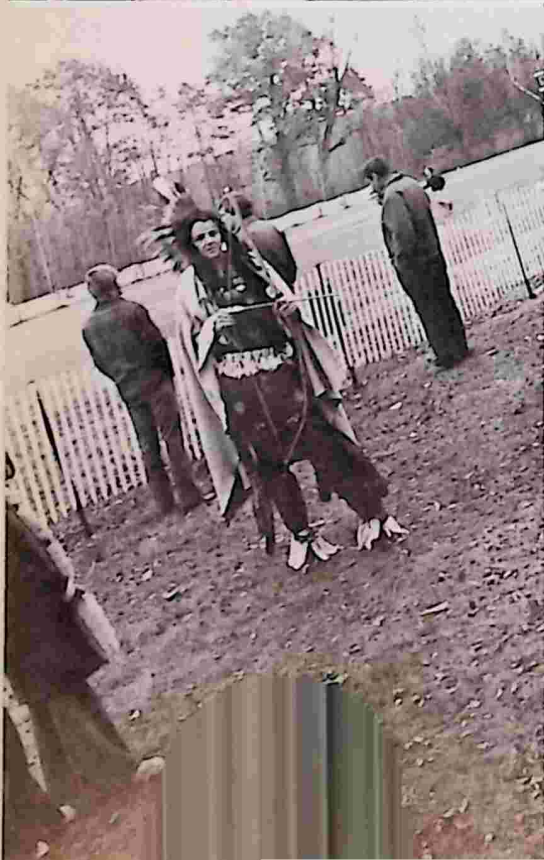
Girls' Intramural Club

Football

With the fine coaching of Head Coach Mike Lilac and Coaches Ken Schmidt and Joe Farnan, the 1973 Warrior Football Team had a rebuilding year. After the loss of 13 lettermen via the graduation route and with the return of only four veteran players, field experience was limited. Even though the team did not have a winning season (0-7-1), its members gave one hundred percent. Senior quarterback Kevin Connor was in control of most of the games. Junior backs Bruce Bochette and Tom Boucher did tremendous running to keep up with the excellent passing of Connor. The blocking of senior tackles Geoff Brewster and "Duke" DeCota was outstanding.

The field performances of three players earned them special recognition and awards. Junior Bruce Bochette was named All League Defensive Halfback. Senior Bill Moore received honorable mention for All League Middle Linebacker, and junior Tom Boucher received honorable mention for All League Fullback.

We are proud of the effort our 1973 Warrior Football Team displayed this year; and with eleven sophomores and seven juniors returning for action, we are sure the 1974 Warriors will have a winning season.

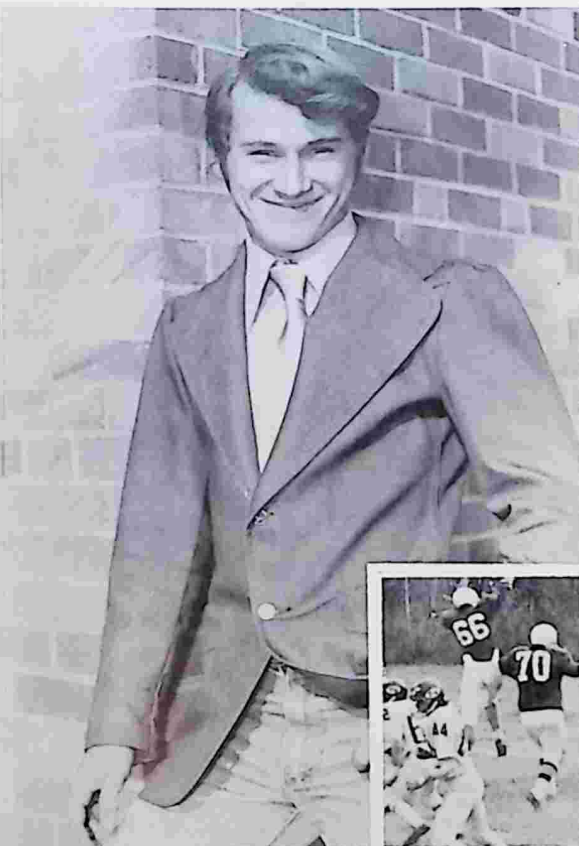

J.V. Basketball

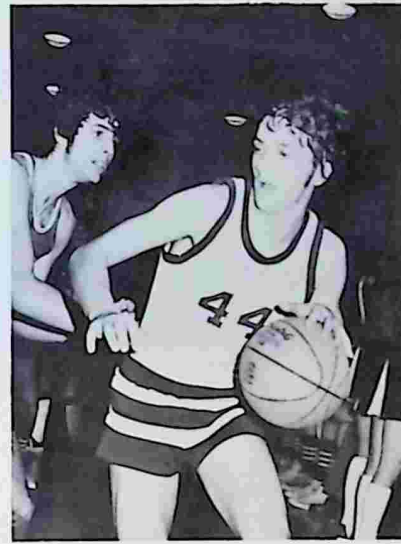

Coach is very optimistic that next year's players will be able to fill the spots left vacant by the loss of this year's team.

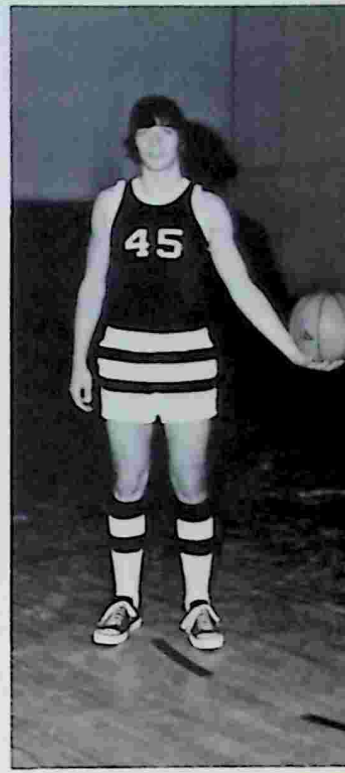

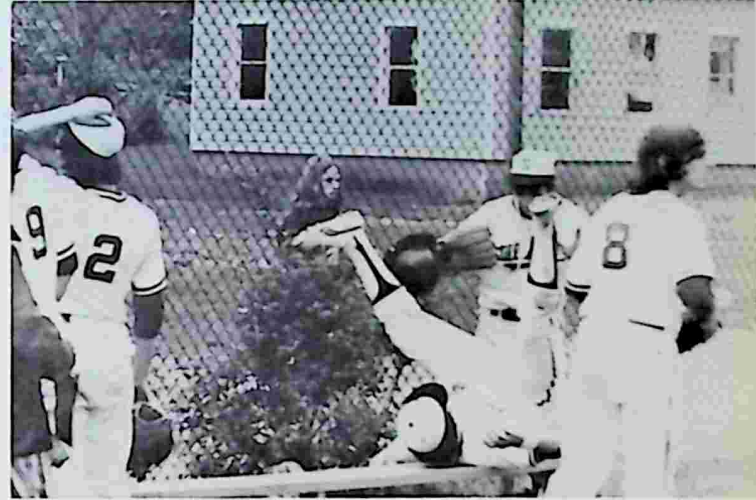


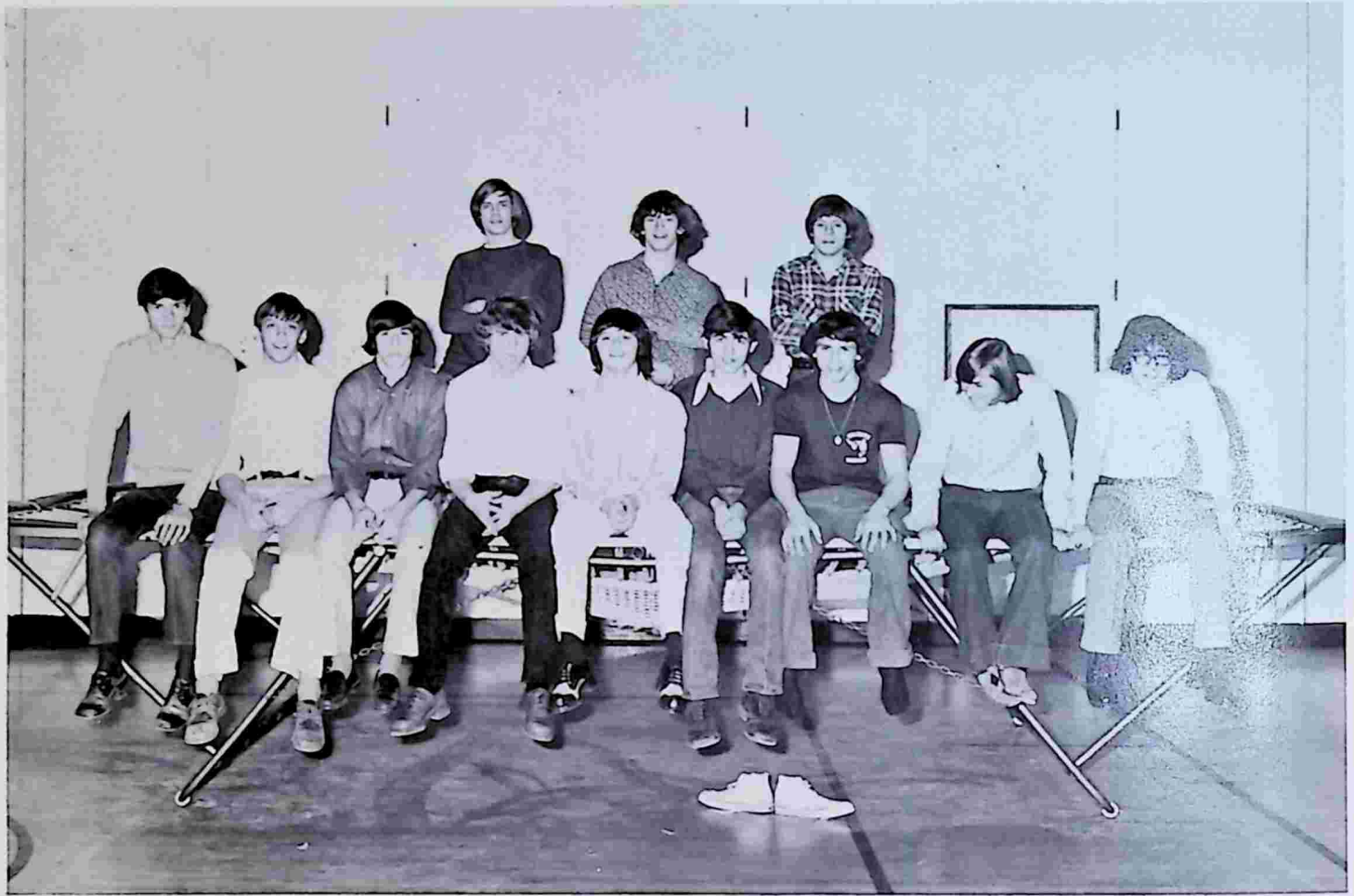
Varsity Baseball

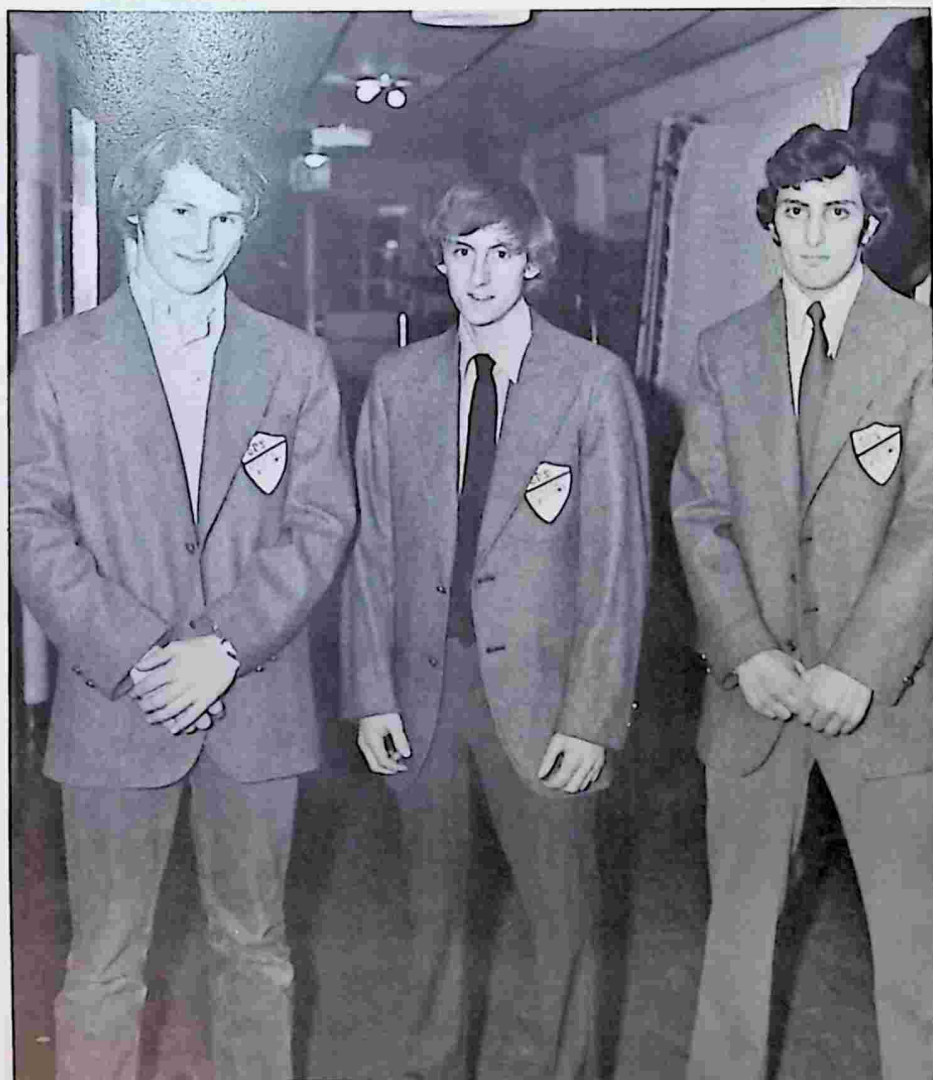
1973 Track Team

In his third year at the helm, Coach MacDougall had one of the largest turnouts for track in the history of the school. Decisive victories were earned over Waterford and Hoosick Falls. Many achievements of the team occurred at the League Meet in Schuylerville. Fine performances were put in by Robert Ether, Joe Robison, and the 880-relay team. Also, Stillwater's pole vaulter, Paul Rivers, won the league championship in this event. During the season, he broke his own school record that he had set in 1973 with a vault of 11 feet. According to Coach MacDougall, Paul was one of the best vaulters in Stillwater's history. Another record was set during the year by the two-mile relay team of Tom Boucher, Mitch Bouyea, Joe Mehan, and Mike Kardash who ran it in 9:35:9.

With the nucleus of last year's team returning, the 1974 Warriors should have plenty of dedication, determination, and desire to win and surpass the new school records set in 1973.
